

## 100 Miles for 100 Years

100 year old veteran, William Cooksey, who recently turned 100 years has set a challenge for himself which many younger, able bodied people would struggle with. The fantastic feat will involve walking TEN miles every day for TEN days, making a total of 100 miles. William's nephew has started a gofundme page where donations can be made and will benefit 'County Durham and Darlington NHS Foundation Trust'. Pat Chambers from the Trust said "We are totally humbled to know that William has chosen our NHS Charity to fundraise for as he takes on this mammoth challenge of walking 10 miles every day for



10 days. What an absolute hero - who would believe that only days after celebrating his 100th birthday he would want to do this for us? Thank you William, a true local hero and we hope our communities can support him as he takes on this challenge. Thank you so very much."

William has previously, in the 1980s, completed walks such as Pennine Way, Coast to Coast, Offas Dye and the West Highland Wav.

# **Great Aycliffe Cancer Support Group Dates for your Diary**

With one in two people affected by cancer, Great Aycliffe Cancer Support Group is providing an ever-growing and valuable lifeline to families affected by cancer - not just in Newton Aycliffe but in surrounding towns and villages.

Throughout lockdown, the charity's services were still in great demand, from transporting patients to and from hospital to helping with benefits claims, acting as a conduit between patients and health professionals, providing gifts and much more besides.

Many vulnerable cancer patients were also left in isolation during lockdown and the charity was able to offer friendly support and a chat on the phone.

However, Covid lockdowns have resulted in a reduction in the vital funds that are needed to carry on this important work.

Last month alone, the charity spent around £1,500 on transport costs. And although drivers are all volunteers, the number of patients needing transport to and from hospitals in Darlington, Bishop Auckland, Durham, Middlesbrough and Newcastle, has increased along with the cost of fuel.

Allison White, who founded the charity after suffering from leukaemia herself and experiencing a gap in support provision for people with ALL types of cancer, is urging townsfolk to get behind this vital service - either through volunteering as a driver or by supporting the events that are planned for the rest of the year. The charity is also particularly in need of tombola and raffle prizes. ## William is 100 Years Young

#### William (Bill) Cooksey

Bill was born in the village of Deri in the coal mining area of South Wales.

His father was diagnosed with TB soon after his birth and became permanently unemployed so the family lived in poverty on 57p a week national assistance. William had 5 siblings, 4 of whom died between 1922 and 1934. During the 1926 miner's strike they used the village soup kitchen. In 1933, William won a free scholarship to Lewis School, Pengam, a prestigious grammar school (Neil Kinnock was Head Prefect in the 1950s).

In 1937 the family moved to Papworth near Cambridge. Bill joined the RAF in April 1940 as an airframe fitter and spent four years in the Middle East during World War 2. His convoy was torpedoed in mid-Atlantic, which missed his ship and hit an adjacent troop ship.

He narrowly escaped being captured in the Western Desert in July 1942. William later flew as an extra lookout in a Wellington Bomber in operations from Benghazi with an Air Sea Rescue Squadron. Posted to a



Communication Flight he was later forced to land in Cyprus with engine trouble. He spent 6 weeks living in the aircraft waiting for a new engine.

In 1948 he was posted to a Flying Training School in Southern Rhodesia and secretly married Kathleen in June 1950 in Bulawayo for a total cost £5.2s.6d spending their honeymoon at Victoria Falls cost £30. In 1951 the couple returned to the UK and settled near Cambridge. He was employed in various occupations including farm work, factory work, photographer and journalist and served twelve years as Clerk to Harlton Parish Council as well as producing a monthly parish magazine on a hand operated duplicator which he sold for £1 a

William qualified as a teacher at Saffron Walden (Cambridge University), he left state education after teaching at a junior school in Cambridge from 1971 to 1981 and became a private tutor. His other accolades include writing some of the first computer programmes for schools with the ZX81 and Spectrum and published his own books. From the proceeds he purchased his first home in 1984.

The couple moved to Newton Aycliffe in 1991. They had 3 children - all University trained teachers. The youngest is now the Headmaster of The International School in

Kathleen passed away in 2017 after being married for 67 years. William celebrated his 100th birthday on Thursday 19th August 2021 by walking along the seafront at Seaton Carew and enjoying a fish and chip lunch. The following day he rode six miles on his tricycle.

# Aycliffe Cricket Club Scoreboard Report



Newton Aycliffe Cricket Club's 1st team, sponsored by Franks the Flooring Store, played two games over the bank holiday weekend and came away with a draw and a defeat.

On the Saturday they visited second in the table Marton 2nd XI in the NYSD second division and earned a hard fought draw. The homeside chose to bat first and were restricted to 188 for 7 from their allotted 50 overs with 16 year old Matty Greaves (sponsored by Britannia Fire Ltd) the pick of the Aycliffe bowlers taking 3 for 21. In reply, club stalwart Chris Palmer top scored with 32 from 45 balls and opener Luke Telford also batted well with 24 runs from 28 balls faced. However Aycliffe lost wickets at regular intervals and were thankful for a defiant unbeaten 16 off 59 balls from 14 year old Thomas Dearden and a battling 13 runs off 29 balls by Matty Greaves, which pushed their side to 149 for 9 at stumps and helped Aycliffe earn the draw.

On bank holiday Monday, Aycliffe hosted Rockliffe Park 1st XI and were soundly beaten by 87 runs (game sponsored by Midland Structural Services). Aycliffe won the toss, asked the visitors to bat first and at the half way stage this looked to be a good decision as the visitors were bowled out for 146 after 45 overs thanks to good performances with the ball by Matty Greaves (3 for 36), Michael Howe (3 for 42), George Slatcher (2 for 11) and James Layfield-Carroll (sponsored by Unison) taking 2 for 26. In reply, Aycliffe were reduced to an astonishing 16 for 8 after some pretty dreadful batting and were thankful for a last wicket partnership of 29 between James Layfield-Carroll (18 not out) and George Slatcher (10 runs) to give the innings some substance before being dismissed for 59, their lowest score of the season, after 23.5 overs.

The second team made the short trip away to third in the table Sedgefield 2nd XI in their final NYSD 4th division game of the season and were easily beaten by nine wickets. Aycliffe decided to bat first and were bowled out for just 68 after 27.4 overs with only Leo Mercy (sponsored by Joint Design Direction) with 22 runs, Owen Smith (12 runs), Ryan Patrick (11 runs) and Joe Teasdale (10 runs) reaching double figures. In reply, the homeside coasted to victory after 23.5 overs with Harrison Pearson (1 for 6) taking the only wicket to fall.

Despite this heavy defeat, the young Aycliffe second team finished their season with a playing record that reads: Played 22, Won 5, Lost 8, Drew 3 and six games not played due to bad weather and Covid-19. The final points total was 216 and they finished in a very creditable 7th place in the NYSD 4th division.

## **UK City of Culture Bid for Durham Sketch Walk**

County Durham's bid to be UK City of Culture 2025 has the power to bring transformational social and economic benefits to the entire North East, according to the partnership driving forward the campaign.

The message coincides with an announcement from the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport listing the names of the 20 locations across the UK that have expressed an interest in the prestigious

It also comes as more and more business leaders, arts organisations and individuals from across the region voice their support for County Durham.

This is the first year submissions can cover county areas as well as cities, which has led to a record number of entries. Durham's bid incorporates the whole county, providing an opportunity to showcase and develop the area's diverse cultural offer - from its varied landscapes and rich heritage, to its inclusive arts scene, vibrant communities and pioneering academic research. The initial bid was submitted by Durham County Council, with principal partner Durham University, on behalf of Culture Durham. This is a partnership of organisations, including Beamish Museum, the Auckland Project and other public, private and voluntary organisations that share the same belief in the power of culture to transform lives.

Cllr Elizabeth Scott, Durham County Council's Cabinet member for economy and partnerships, said: "Becoming UK City of Culture 2025 would not only enrich the lives of our communities by creating new and exciting cultural activities, it would boost our economy, significantly increase visitor numbers, both in County Durham and the wider region, and lead to additional investment and new employment



opportunities.

"Hull was UK City of Culture in 2017 and the figures speak for themselves. City of Culture was directly responsible for almost £90 million of investment in the city and a ten per cent increase in tourism.

"In County Durham, we know that if we increase the number of visitors staying overnight from eight per cent to 16 per cent, we can boost our economy by £415 million. "We recognise that culture and tourism will play a crucial role in our recovery from the impact of the pandemic, and we have a longstanding commitment to culture-led

"UK City of Culture status would support these efforts by raising our profile nationally. In fact, this is already happening, with the #Durham2025 campaign providing a platform for us all to shout about what makes our county great."

The winning location will be announced in May 2022, with the twenty bidders reduced to an initial long list next month and a final shortlist announced in early 2022.

I am from a group of young people who recently completed our NCS programme in Darlington and are wanting to spread awareness of period poverty and support local groups in fighting this cause. We have teamed up with local foodbanks and are working on a partnership with supermarkets in




Darlington to create boxes similar to those you see for foodbanks. Within our boxes we are aiming to collect hygiene and sanitary products that will be collected and stored by the King's Church foodbank, they can then be distributed to different locations. These locations would include schools (if they require more products after RedBox Project stopped providing products), refuges (like the ones housing people who came from Afghanistan) and different foodbanks who have a shortage of our collected products. The goal isn't to stop period poverty, as it's a difficult situation to beat, but to reduce the number of women and young girls who can't afford necessary products for themselves.

Around Darlington town centre shops have been raising awareness of our campaign by putting posters up within their stores that has a link to our social media (@darlingtonperiodpoverty on Instagram) and statistics linked directly to period poverty that really opens the eyes of readers to a problem they didn't know existed. Making her competitive debut season, local U13 girl shines against top athletes from the North East. ## Gin Making - Heads, Hearts & Tails . . .

The most asked questions at The Herbal Gin Company are about how we make our gin and how long it takes for the whole process. The distillation process itself does not take long. Whereas whisky has to be kept in storage for a minimum of 3 years and a day, gin is fortunately much quicker to make. To understand the process of gin making, needs

attention to detail. So here goes....
Our still is a beautiful 250 litre piece of equipment that digitally controls temperature to one tenth of a degree and to the individual second. Add to this our recipes of botanicals that weigh up to 1kg per distillation run, which are measured in turn to 0.1g and you have an accurate formula and process that allows for a reproducible product, distillation run after distillation run.

The distillation starts with a column rinse and tank wash. The column is relatively short compared to the column of an old fashioned still, the secret digitisation and mechanical elements of the distillation tower equate to an old distillation tower height of 15m, working to the same efficiency of distillation but with an accompanying significant improvement of energy efficiency (something close to our heart at The Herbal Gin Company). Copper coils are then introduced into the

column. These coils assist in the flavourmaking, as the distillation vapour has to work its way past the coils, in order to rise to the top of the still. In doing so, flavour production is improved.

However, first things first. The still needs to be filled with a 250 litre mixture of water and ethyl alcohol, the ABV needed to produce an ideal alcohol concentration is 33% (i.e. 1L of 100% alcohol for every 2L of water)

This is then heated up by an oil filled jacket that surrounds the still. Stills can be heated by this oil jacket method or by an immersion coil. The coil option is no different in truth to an electric kettle – effective but limited. The oil jacket gives more options for heating such things as potatoes - thereby making a lovely potato vodka (something we are keen to try in the future). At the moment though, we restrict ourselves to water, alcohol and botanicals whilst distilling.

The botanicals are measured with pinpoint accuracy and enclosed in a linen bag that is gently agitated 9 times a minute whilst heating, as the alcohol, water and botanical combination is heated.

Alcohol boils at 78 deg C. Water boils at 100 deg C. This means that, as the mixture within the still is heated, the first thing to vapourise is mainly alcohol. However, this is where heads, hearts and tails come in...

**Heads** - this is the first thing to be collected. Don't shout about it though, it's only good for cleaning your windows (although it smells awesome and is indeed a fantastic window cleaner). This is because it doesn't taste great, and if there is any methanol anywhere, this is where it will be collected.

Hearts - this is the awesome stuff. Collecting 80L or so of 76% ABV gin is a lovely thing to behold. If you are brave enough to sample a (very) small amount, it tastes almost creamy! Often any citrus added to the recipe will be predominant at this first stage of the hearts draining, adding to the intensity of flavour as the first drops appear.

Tails - this is less good to taste. Remember that we are heating up botanicals in water/ alcohol and just as happens to tea when the bag is left too long in the pot, the same happens with gin. This is where the all



important decision about 'making the cut' comes into the distillers remit. We will not give away our secret, suffice to say that our 'cut' comes earlier than most. We value quality of product over volume production and so our yield is less than some may demand for their distillation runs but we feel the sacrifice is more than worth it for the quality of end-product.

The distillation then finishes and the hearts are left to 'rest' after adding water to the solution to allow for the magical 40% ABV to be obtained.

The following week we bottle. Many people ask why we leave the gin resting for all this time. Whilst we cannot define what exactly happens during this time (nobody can), be assured that the resting time adds to the flavour.

Thereafter, bottling, labelling and sealing are undertaken to allow for our end product. In articles to come, I will discuss recipe development, in particular what makes a good recipe and what does not. In the meantime, I hope that this article has stimulated your taste buds sufficiently to investigate further.

Indeed, if you are interested in making your very own gin recipe, then come along to our Herbal Gin Experience where you can become a distiller for a day but make a recipe that will last a lifetime

My week started with a couple of visits, the first being to Acorn Dairy, which is a farm based not far from Aycliffe at Archdeacon Newton between Walworth and Darlington. They sell their milk and other products primarily to the local markets and it was a pleasure to see their operations and meet local members of the NFU (National Farmers Union). They are doing some fantastic development work to enable school children to visit and see how a farm works. The other visit was to a small business in Middleton St George where we discussed banking services. Wednesday saw me start at NETPark to help promote potential inward investment before coming to Newton Aycliffe. Once here I started at the Veterans Hub, this was being opened by The Lord Lieutenant, Sue Snowden, along with Veteran, Scott Robertson. I spent a great couple of hours talking to the many veterans and volunteers present and if you know any veterans who would like support from them or indeed want to support veterans yourself, just get in touch, or call down and buy some of their fantastic products.

I had a call with the ladies leading the Darlington and County Durham Rape and Sexual Abuse Counselling Centre to understand their work and make sure we know how best to contact them should any constituents reach out to us.

I welcomed Robert Jenrick, the Secretary of State for MHCLG, to Newton Aycliffe on Thursday, visiting the new housing development at Elder Gardens. This includes some houses in the pilot scheme offering 30% discount to key workers and this is only the 3rd site in the country to offer this. MHCLG stands for Ministry for Housing, Communities and local Government. Departmental responsibilities include driving up housing supply; increasing home ownership; devolving powers and budgets to boost local growth in England and supporting strong communities with excellent public services. His team are Luke

Hall MP, Minister for Regional Growth and Local Government; The Rt Hon Christopher Pincher MP, Minister for Housing; Eddie Hughes MP, Minister for Rough Sleeping & Housing and Lord Stephen Greenhalgh, Minister for Building Safety and Communities.

Whilst he was here to talk housing, I also took the opportunity to talk about regional devolution and the importance of County Durham getting a solution that enables it to control its destiny and not be overwhelmed by its neighbours to the north.

I had an update from the Police and Crime Commissioner as regards the proposed new custody suite being proposed for Durham. She has decided to proceed with the previous proposal, whilst this appears to be the preference of the police as well, it is important that full consideration is given to the estate as a whole. The amount being spent on the custody suite is significant so there are concerns that this could put pressure elsewhere later, but she has assured me this is not the case. I had the pleasure of calling at the community event at Silverdale Place led by Junction 7, Durham Community Action and Livin. The weather just about held together despite trying to rain several times. A great event and a credit to everyone involved. Friday teatime I called down The Big Club to see Joanne and Nev Jones and team for the family disco event they were putting on. Some of their normal team were busy so I ended up on door duty. The attendance was incredible and it was fabulous to see so many smiling faces and hopefully they made some money for the Shine choir. On Bank Holiday Monday I was out and about in Thornley, Wingate and Station Town and saw the end of a dog show as well as talking to residents about their concerns with regards to anti-social behaviour issues. Things generally feel like we are heading back to a more normal world, but it is absolutely critical that we do not get complacent. The importance of continuing to take every opportunity to maximise fresh air and using masks when appropriate remains and if you have not yet been vaccinated please do so. Should we see upturns in infections it is vaccinations that will mean that these do not translate into hospital admissions or, worse still, deaths. So please don't waste the efforts of our NHS and get yourself jabbed.
