We have athletes in our town who have sacrificed a great deal to achieve their goal to be selected to play for their country, but success when it comes, does so with a hefty price tag firmly attached. The moments in the spotlight and the adulation of the crowds is insignificant compared to the years of training, driving thousands of miles to different venues and training camps just so the coaches can see if you have what it takes to represent your country in your chosen discipline.

Some sports have a high profile and readily attract sponsorship which takes some of the financial pressure off the athletes themselves allowing them to concentrate on what they do best which is excelling at their chosen discipline at the highest level. Sports such as water polo have to try and generate their own sponsorship to make their dream a reality. We are lucky to have several junior and senior water polo players who have national status but with the dream comes a reality check of the sometimes crippling personal financial costs involved in putting on a GB tracksuit and representing your country.

These athletes, for that's exactly what they are, have to pay for the pleasure and pride of flying our flag. Driving the length and breadth of the country is one thing but when they are selected to represent our country in international competitions the costs involved can quickly escalate to become thousands of pounds. If no sponsorship is available the athletes and, in the case of the junior squads, their parents must provide the money out of their own pockets. Very few people or companies can afford to commit large sums of

money in the form of sponsorship but would £1.00 break the bank? Would £1.00 make a difference? It would if every person in the town could gave £1.00. A pound per week could be in excess of £20,000 per week and if you extended that for just one year the total amount raised would be over a £1,000,000.

A silly dream; but in the words of Margaret Mead, "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful committed citizens can change the world: Indeed, it's the only thing that ever has". A silly unrealistic dream I know, but it's team work that makes the dream work. Cllr Phillip Hawkins

For the first time in the Club's history Natasha Grainger received the ladies player of the year, the Club having had a senior ladies team and girls under 11's team playing competitive league cricket in 2021. Rebuild of Greenfield Community College

A £20m rebuild of a County Durham school is being put forward to enhance standards of education for students.

Durham County Council's Cabinet will next week be recommended to agree to the redevelopment of Greenfield Community College's

Newton Aycliffe site, following an options appraisal.

Councillors will also be asked to approve consultation being carried out on the permanent closure of the school's Sunnydale site at Shildon, following the decision to temporarily close it last year on

health and safety grounds.

The meeting next Wednesday, 13 October, will be reminded how, following an Ofsted inspection judgement of 'inadequate', Sunnydale School in Shildon was amalgamated with Greenfield School at Newton Aycliffe. Greenfield School was enlarged at the beginning of 2015 to become Greenfield Community College, following the closure of Sunnydale as a separate school.

Education was initially delivered across both sites but a report to Cabinet sets out how this did not address the underlying challenges evident before the amalgamation. The split-site approach has limited the delivery of a broad curriculum impacting on standards while pupil numbers continued to fall.

The meeting will be reminded how in January 2020 all pupils began to be taught on the Greenfield site, after health and safety concerns led governors to temporarily close Sunnydale.

Cabinet will be told that council officers have considered options for improved educational provision.

They acted in response to falling pupil numbers impacting on standards and financially viability of the school across two sites; and Ofsted inspections and Department for Education advisers identifying the split-site arrangement as inhibiting educational improvement and progress.

The report sets out how, of four options considered, making the current temporary arrangements permanent and consulting on closure of the Sunnydale site is "the most compelling in terms of all factors - enhanced standards, minimal disruption to learning, improvement of accommodation and cost efficiency.'

It tells councillors that the decision to locate all pupils at Greenfield temporarily has allowed for a better standard of education and how a recent Ofsted monitoring visit reflected the improvements arising from moving to single-site provision.

Councillors will be told that it would cost around £20m to remodel the Aycliffe site to accommodate all pupils in an improved educational environment, and that funding would be sought either through the National Schools Rebuilding Programme or the council's Medium Term Financial Plan.

Cllr Ted Henderson, the council's Cabinet member for children and young people's services, said: "The provision of a high standard of education to our children and young people is at the heart of everything we do and the options appraisal we have carried out for Greenfield Community College has sought to explore how best to provide this in a form that will be sustainable for the communities it serves in the long term.

"We also know that both Ofsted and the Department for Education have advocated a move to a single-site school to offer the best possible education. While we fully appreciate there is a desire in the Shildon community for secondary education to be offered there, pupil numbers show there is not a justification for this, either educationally or financially. We firmly believe that a rebuilt Greenfield Community College is the best option to provide a sustainable long term model of education for the communities it serves and that this would allow the school to build on the improvements made since moving to a single





Minister Rejects Call to Keep £20 Universal Credit Uplift

The government has rejected calls for the £20 uplift to universal credit to be retained. This will result, according to Lib Dem councillor Mark Wilkes, in over 52,000 people across the County losing over £1000 in income from the end of next month.

In July Durham County Councillor Mark Wilkes got agreement from the Joint Administration running the Council for it to write to the government to ask that they halt the withdrawal of the £20 uplift to universal credit, which was introduced last year to help people during the pandemic.

Cllr Wilkes says, "The pressures on low income families have not gone away. If anything there are more pressures with rising prices. Universal Credit is paid to a huge number of people who are working in our county. Removing this uplift is going to have a significant impact on the County taking over £52million out of the local economy at a time when it needs it."

"The government doesn't seem to realise that taking over £1000 out of the pockets of those on the lowest incomes is going to massively impact on attempts to level up across the poorer parts of the UK and in particular the North East."

Many Conservative MPs as well as six former conservative welfare secretaries have also called on the government to retain the uplift in

In the response sent to Durham County Council from the government welfare minister Will Quince he said, "The Government has always been clear that the £20 increase was a temporary measure to support households affected by the economic shock of COVID-19."

Cllr Wilkes challenging this responded saying "The leaders of the council had asked for it to be retained to make sure there wasn't a detrimental impact on those receiving it. I am absolutely certain that scrapping the uplift is going to cost the government and the Council more money, down the line, than it will save."

"We urge the Government to reconsider this decision and recognise the disproportionate impact this is going to have on those areas of the Country they say they want to level up."

Aycliffe Angels Blue Plaque

Dear Sir,

A blue plaque honouring the Aycliffe Angels will be unveiled on Saturday 23rd October at ROF59, the site of the former Second World War munition factory in Newton Aycliffe. We would like to invite people from the local community, many of whom will have connections with the Aycliffe Angels. Invitations have also been sent to all County Councillors for the Great Aycliffe area as well as all Town Councillors and Mr Howell, MP. By way of a bit of background information, the reason for the female blue plaque nominations was Lyn Gibson, secretary of the Women's Banner Group (WBG), discovered there were no blue plaques in County Durham dedicated to women. Lyn subsequently organised a hustings event for the WBG to change that at the Durham Miners' Hall in March 2019. WBG invited members of the public to submit nominations.

Being from a military family myself, I decided to nominate the Aycliffe Angels. All nominations were voted on and the winning three plaques submitted by WBG to DCC were the Aycliffe Angels, Kate Maxey (one of the most decorated nurses in WW1) and Bella Lawson (a passionate pioneer and promoter of Child Welfare Clinics from 1919 until her death in 1968).

There will be three blue plaque events taking place on the same day in County Durham with the Aycliffe Angels event being the first of the day.

The event at ROF59 is scheduled for 10.00am on Saturday 23rd October with a couple of short speeches and an unveiling of the plaque. The plaque will be placed on the outside of the building and ROF59 have agreed to use that space and the area of the Blitz Restaurant for this event. We hope by using that combined space we can ensure as many people who want to attend can attend and in a safe way. We are very grateful to the Finley family for their help with this event.



Whilst we are in party conference season and Westminster is in recess, I have been able to get out and about in the constituency. Tuesday started with a visit to Roman for a catch up on their plans, and some nice coffee and cake, thanks Kay. I then went to the Aycliffe Secure Centre where I was able to see the incredible achievements of staff who are working with some young people from extraordinarily challenging backgrounds, I was massively impressed by their commitment and delivery. After holding a surgery at Middleton St George, I then went to County Hall at Durham to join a briefing on Levelling Up investments in the Sedgefield Constituency by Durham County Council. The primary points were around Aycliffe Town Centre and the Ferryhill Station railway project.

There we had a representation about speeding traffic in Middridge, I will push that concern to the police and the Police and Crime Victim's Commissioner. No Consideration for Driver Training

From 1st January 1997 to tow a large trailer a driver had to sit a test set by the DVSA, these changes created the need for companies like mine to supply the training for drivers wishing to hold this licence. On the 10th September 2021 the DVSA announced that they will no longer be conducting B+E trailer tests to make room for more HGV tests and are expecting for the law to change back to as it was pre-1997. This announcement has had a staggering effect on me and many hundreds of other small businesses.

From that one email my business income has stopped. I have been a driving instructor for close to 30 years and worked tirelessly for the last 15 to grow this part of my business, on target to sit around 400 B+E driving tests in the 12 months following Covid shutdown. Certainly, putting us amongst the largest of B+E trainers in the North East. We are a family run business with my partner working in the office and myself with other family members and staff conducting the training. I have invested in vehicles and trailers, a rented hard standing plot to conduct our reversing exercise, taken a bounce back loan, upgraded our computer system

My vehicles and the bounce back loan still have to be paid for, I have wages to pay but no income because of this heartless, reckless decision to stop B+E tests. Do I sell my vehicles at a loss, make my staff and family redundant? Should I hold on and wait for the government to advise me on what proposals they have for road safety?

We, as an industry have been forgotten, no help or advice offered, simply dismissed by an email on that Friday night.

This decision has been made as a knee jerk reaction to the lack of HGV drivers but no thought has been given to the people working in this industry, or to road safety. If this law change is put in place any driver will be allowed to hitch a large trailer, caravan to a car or pickup truck and drive without any experience or training, yet the DVSA say it will have no effect on road safety. If this is true then how have many thousands of drivers failed to reach the test standard set by the DVSA even after training? Are we, as a country, really prepared to step back nearly 25 years in road safety and endanger our public and road users as a reaction to the lack of HGV drivers?

Over the last few days, I have seen and listened to Grant Shapps on TV, in my expert opinion he has no idea on what he is doing or saying.

He said it takes about three weeks to become an HGV driver, it takes longer than that to book the medical, then around 10 weeks for the DVLA to send a provisional licence, followed by driver training, a driver CPC and then test - 3 weeks!

He also stated that 50,000 HGV driving tests made available are getting snapped up. This is simply not true, the examiners are sitting in the test centres with no work and thousands of tests available.

In my opinion the government are going completely the wrong way about things, they are destroying businesses like mine and endangering the public by simply not looking at the real cause of this problem. The government decisions are destroying jobs, endangering road safety and are so inefficient to the point that MPs are prepared to lie on national TV. Jack Braley
