Due to the amount and high calibre of nominations received, the Howarth family have decided to increase the prize pool and have added three more prizes worth £100 to each of the winners.

The main prize of £250, certificate and glass award trophy was presented to Pamela Lovelass this week at the Newton Press offices, Blue Bridge Centre.

Pam has been a resident of Newton Aycliffe since the age of 18 and has undergone many occupations including catering at Stephenson Way School, Woodham Comprehensive, St Mary's and Vane Road. Pam took early retirement in her late 40s due to illness. She has been a regular church attendee since 1968, being a Sunday School Teacher and Tawny Owl Brownie Leader.

A course in Chaplaincy at Ushaw Moor saw her placed at the very busy Metro Centre, later becoming Newton Aycliffe Town Centre Chaplain, also completing a three year Living Theology Today course in Durham Diocese.

## Middridge **Parish Council**

#### **Brian Hall**

It is with sadness that we note the passing of Brian Hall, a true friend and supporter of Middridae.

Pre-1982 Brian and Tommy Bennet were elected councillors on Shildon Town Council, to represent Middridge which then came within the Shildon Parish Boundary. In 1982, with the support of the then Sedgefield District Council, Middridge was encouraged to become a separate Parish. Brian became a member of the steering group along with Tommy Bennet, Anne Clark, Wally Mellors and John Watt who put forward a bid for Middridge to become a separate

This was successful, and in 1983 Middridge Parish came into being with Brian Hall being elected as one of our five Parish Councillors. He served as Chairman on three separate occasions, 1984-85, 1989-90 and 1993-94. Brian eventually decided to stand down from Middridge Parish Council to concentrate more on Great Aycliffe Town Council. During his time on Middridge Parish Council his experience made him a valued member of the team for many years.

Brian was also involved with the Middridge Village Hall Committee together with myself and other valued members of the community and it was he and his wife Thelma who freely provided the fabric and made up the curtains for the village hall windows, plus, while they had the furnishing business in Aycliffe, he could always be relied upon to provide a prize for the annual Village Fete Raffle. ## Swimmers Back in Action

Six Sedgefield 75 swimmers returned to the Billingham Forum pool last weekend for a competition, this time hosted by the Borough of Stockton Swim Scheme. Named the Winter Swimming Festival and was touted as the last chance to achieve qualifying times for the coming regional championships to be held in Sheffield.

It was a tough competition with almost all the North East's top clubs taking part. The action started on Friday evening with Emma Price slashing over seven seconds from her 400m freestyle personal best winning gold by over six seconds and breaking 600 FINA ranking points for the first time in the process. Saturday morning and Emma took silver in 200m freestyle, then Tom Curran and Filip Wilczynski swam 50m butterfly, Filip taking silver. Charlotte Lee swam 100m breaststroke before Filip & Tom completed 100m backstroke, this time Filip going one better taking gold and Tom improving his best time by more than a second. Last swim of the morning was Emma again with a PB and bronze in 100m individual medley. On to Saturday afternoon and Charlotte was right on her PB in 50m freestyle before Oliver Turnbull set a new 50m breaststroke best. Emma then took back-to-back 4th positions in 200m backstroke and 100m butterfly before Tom and Oliver rounded off the day with good 100m freestyle swims. Back to the pool on Sunday morning and Tom and Filip started things off with 50m backstroke, another PB for Tom and another gold for Filip. Emma took her second gold



with another big PB in 200m breaststroke and followed that up with another PB in 100m backstroke. Oliver and Filip swam the 100m individual medley next, both setting big PB's and another silver for Filip. In the last session, Emma completed the gruelling 400m individual medley with a huge 6 seconds PB earning a silver medal. Charlie McEwan then joined for 50m freestyle, also swimming that were Oliver and Tom, all 3 setting quick times. Charlotte then swam a PB in 50m breaststroke. Filip rounded off the competition with a PB and gold in 200m backstroke and silver in 100m butterfly. All swimmers again supported each other, had a great time and were a credit to the club. The next competition for the club is the first championship competition since Covid the North East region short course championships being held at the international swimming venue Ponds Forge in Sheffield, 4 swimmers having gained some qualifying times.



David Stothard took on the 10K race, completing the run in 1:01:58, whilst brother lan completed the 5K race in 42:57. In Scarborough, several Members took on the Yorkshire Coast 10K, which started at the Spa and took runners along the seafront to the North Bay, before returning back along Marine Drive. 

When we left Westminster for conference recess, a few short weeks ago, I could not have imagined how sad the place would feel when I returned this week. It was devastating enough to hear that James Brokenshire had lost his fight with cancer last week, but the appalling murder of Sir David Amess took this to a whole new level. The whole of Westminster felt in shock on Monday and I anticipate it remaining so for some time as people attempt to process the enormity of what happened last Friday. On Monday I sat in the chamber and listened to the many tributes to Sir David from across the house, they were unanimous in their reflections of a man who was universally liked. Whilst Sir David had been in parliament for close to 40 years, he had never become a minister, he spent his entire time as a backbench MP and was totally committed to his constituents. This did not mean he was not active in parliament as he pursued many causes and delivered real legislative change. There were numerous stories told about his life in politics and I will share just a couple here with you now.

Sir David was a committed Roman Catholic and one story refers to one of his visits to the Vatican. On this occasion, when queuing to meet the Pope, he inadvertently produced from his pocket a boiled sweet at precisely the time that he was in front of the Pope. The result of this was that his boiled sweet was blessed by His Holiness. This boiled sweet became legendary in subsequent meetings between Sir David and constituents. Another example of his sense of humour arose when he was made a Sir. David celebrated this honour by dressing as a knight of old and riding a horse through his constituency, as a committed monarchist he was incredibly proud to have been knighted. Characters like Sir David and gentlemen like James were key parliamentarians, both James and Sir David will leave a big hole in

parliamentarians, both James and Sir David will leave a big hole in Westminster as they both reflected the best of us. James progressed to ministerial level and Sir David remained a backbencher, but they were both described by so many as 'nice people' and the more people we can have described as such, the better.

One of the concerns of incidents like the atrocious attack on Sir David is the potential for reactions that impact on our underlying democracy. I absolutely share the concerns being raised about the safety of both my staff and constituents when surgeries take place, but I believe that the opportunity for people to engage directly with their MP is a fundamental tenet of open democracy. I will, of course, look to take prudent safety measures but I will continue to offer access to all constituents. This will be by phone, zoom, teams etc., if residents wish, but I shall also continue to facilitate face to face meetings as well.

Please remember that we have a very precious democratic nation that we all should be proud of and I would encourage everyone to not undermine this by abusing our fellow citizens. The recent trend for abuse of people in public life is something we can all work to address. Whether we are referring to MPs, local Councillors, or indeed key workers like shop workers or those in our NHS; it is imperative that we remember that they are people doing a job to the best of their ability. We see too many examples of these people being abused either physically or on social media. This needs to stop and everyone needs to be less aggressive and more considerate. With particular regard to social media, I am increasingly of the opinion that anonymity for those abusing others is inappropriate. I believe that there needs to be an acceptance by platforms like Facebook and Twitter that they have an obligation to identify and share with the authorities the details of those who choose to use their platforms inappropriately and if they do not, then we should legislate accordingly. Moving to 'normal' business, this week saw the start of the committee

Moving to 'normal' business, this week saw the start of the committee stage line by line review of the Nationality and Borders Bill with sessions scheduled on Tuesday and Thursday, mornings and afternoons, for the next few weeks. This will take up a significant part of my week, but it is an important bill.

## Neighbourhood Policing By PC Michael Welch



The Response, CID and Neighbourhood Police teams have been dealing with a variety of issues over the last week, here is a very small snapshot of what we have been up to:

Monday - Beat team assisted our CID colleagues in executing 3 drugs warrants across Newton Aycliffe. A number of arrests have been made and enquires are ongoing. Two males were arrested after a disturbance in the Cobblers Hall car park. This stemmed from a road rage incident where tempers were lost. A male was arrested in connection with a domestic incident where he made threats towards an ex-partner. This male was charged and kept in custody to go before the court. Tuesday - Officers carried out a joint visit on a local vulnerable male

who has been causing issues in the community for some time. Through working with partner agencies, this male has since been taken to hospital for the help he desperately needs. Beat team continued to engage with victims of ASB across the town, particularly in the Western area, to gather evidence to robustly deal with the youths causing issues.

Wednesday - A meeting took place with a supplier of mobile CCTV cameras. The beat team are working with County Councillors to fund two mobile CCTV cameras that can be deployed in areas experiencing problems with ASB or if there is a spike of crime in the area. This will be valuable in tackling issues in the community and providing evidence we need to pursue offenders. A further meeting took place with members of the Durham County Council ASB team to address the rise in Anti-Social Behaviour in the Western area of Newton Aycliffe. Through partnership working two Acceptable Behaviour Contracts have been served to Under 16s, five Community Protection Notice warnings and 3 Community Protection Notices have been served. This process must take place in order to obtain court orders to stop youths causing issues for the community and breaches of them lead to arrest. Livin are also supporting us in relation to ASB offenders when their tenants cause Anti-Social Behaviour in their areas which breaches tenancy agreements. Repeat offenders risk being evicted. An off-road bike was seized on Garburn Place, Newton Aycliffe for causing ASB in the area. The male rider also failed the attitude test and was also reported for a public order offence.

Thursday - Further statements and CCTV was collected to build evidence against ASB offenders across the town.

Friday - Male youth was interviewed under caution for 8 breaches of a Criminal Behaviour Order. This male has been entering an area of Newton Aycliffe, which he is prohibited from, by the Court. Working in collaboration with Livin and the Police, youth workers from the Cornforth Partnership were out in the Western area of Newton Aycliffe trying to engage with the kids and divert them away from causing issues in the area. A fixed penalty ticket was issued in Newton Aycliffe town centre by the beat team after a male was identified buying alcohol for underage youths. This male will now have to pay a £90 fine. Saturday - A male youth was interviewed under caution at the police station for causing damage to a motor vehicle on Pease Way, Newton Aycliffe on the 14th October 2021. He was reported from the offence and will appear at court. He was also served with a Community Protection Notice. Further statements were obtained in relation to other youths committing offences in the Western area.

Sunday - The team arrested a 14 year old male for various offences across the Western area of town. He was released under investigation with strict bail conditions.
