Neighbourhood Policing

Hi everyone, PCSO Kipling here, I hope this finds you all well! This week, we started to properly get back into the local Primary Schools to deliver presentations to the pupils, this Tuesday we attended St. Francis and did presentations on Internet Safety, Bullying, Anti-Social Behaviour & Crime and Consequences to Years 5 & 6. Each child received a certificate from the team and also got the chance to meet Jet & Ben! It was really great to be back in the schools and we look forward to doing the same at Sugar Hill in two week's time, whilst also adding a County Lines presentation to the mix! This engagement is being done to support the enforcement action that we are taking across the town to reduce vulnerability and Anti-Social Behaviour.

Moving on, last week we received a report of Criminal Damage over in the Western Area of town, whereby youths were alleged to have caused substantial damage to an address. Two male youths were arrested that same afternoon, transported to Darlington custody where they were interviewed for this offence. One of these males was charged with Criminal Damage and Resist Arrest and will be attending court in the near future, where we will be asking the court to impose a Criminal Behaviour Order.

Also, on the evening of 4th November going into 5th November, we have had two 2-in-1 Burglaries reported, where three vehicles have been reported stolen, one in the Middridge area and one in the Kirkham Close area of Woodham. We are working closely with our colleagues in CID, collecting evidence, and we hope to have a positive update on this one for you soon. Please, if you have any information which may assist us with this, contact us on 101 or attend the front counter on Central Avenue.

On a more positive note, Inspector Honeyman and Sergeant Boyd attended the opening ceremony of the new Sensory Room at St. Mary's RC Primary School. As a team, we have assisted the school in fundraising activities over the last few years. This is fantastic for the school and community and it was brilliant to be invited to the opening of this, thank you for having us!

Lastly, if you have a couple of minutes spare, please could I ask you to consider signing up to 'Keep in the Know'. This is our online messaging service where we send out local alerts to keep you upto-date on what is happening in Newton Aycliffe. New Sensory Room at St. Mary's School

After realising that there was a need within the school, and the wider local community, for a sensory room to support children with special educational need, the idea for a sensory area was born. The pupils, parents and staff at St. Mary's R.C. Primary School started a two year fundingraising campaign for a building and equipment which culminated in the grand opening of the Sensory Pod on the 5th November 2021 by the Mayoress for Newton Aycliffe Mrs. Sandra Haigh, Sarah Honeyman, Councillor Atkinson and Miss Joanne Wills the SENDCo and Inclusion Lead at St. Mary's. Miss Wills thanked the invited guests including the many generous donors from the local community including, GAMP (Great Aycliffe Middridge Partnership), Community Spirit, Tesco, Honest John, St. Mary's Mini Police team and those who took part in the fundraising event at ROF59 in 2019, in a time pre Covid.

The Sensory Pod project began in September 2019, when Miss Wills noticed, from working with partners within special educational needs education within the local area, that many parents, schools and communities were reaching for support and help in locating and looking for areas with sensory rooms and facilities. It was then that she decided it was time for the school, if it could make a difference. With a plan for fundraising and reaching out into the community, especially to local councillors, Miss Wills set to work. Covid-19 slowed our project. It became evident that the resource of a sensory room would be needed for many children returning to school after two periods of lockdown and, with funding secured, work finally began on a sensory room during the summer holiday in August 2021. Miss Wills even went into school during August to capture the progress so that the children could see the work in progress on their return to school in September.

The Sensory Pod, as it is named, is an eco-friendly building with a wind turbine, solar panels and water butt to collect water for the school vegetable garden and will provide support for individuals in a variety of ways, ranging from:

- Enhance learning through play.
- Improve balance, movement, and spatial orientation.
- Develop communication skills.
- De-stress.
- Improves focus.
- Promote socialisation.

The children and staff at St. Mary's are so proud to have this facility to offer to neighbouring schools and to support the wider school community.

When The Blood Red Poppy is No More

As I stood at the grave of an Unknown Soldier I bowed my head in respect I silently gave thanks for the sacrifice he and so many of his fallen comrades had made. My moment of quiet contemplation came to an end as a soft and gentle voice broke the silence. 'Such a waste of life'.

Lost in my own thoughts, I failed to hear a veteran approach and stand next to me. I turned to face him as I said I would take a moment to pay my respects and leave a Poppy as a token of my thanks.

"Ah the poppy of remembrance; less you forget us. We gave so much and you give us a blood red poppy in return as a token of your appreciation".

I don't understand!

"That is why you have to make more and more poppies every year. You still don't understand or have learnt the lessons from history that demanded our sacrifice. Your gratitude is a wonderful thing but there is little point in remembering us if you fail to learn from our death. In life, war is the ultimate obscenity and no amount of poppies will ever change that. We did not give our lives to be honoured by an artificial flower, but to help you recognise the futility of war so that you would never have to pay the price that we did. In that we have failed. If you wish to honour the fallen bow your head, say thank you for the time when you will choose peace over war, and the blood red poppy will be no more".

Then he was gone and I was left alone with my thoughts and wondered if the day will ever dawn when the lesson is finally learnt and Remembrance Day becomes a day of celebration, of when the poppy is no more.

It states: 'The service was exceptionally well-led by managers who were very proactive in addressing the needs of staff and the people who used the service. They ensured staff were well supported and competent to carry out their roles'. Staff echoed the comments made by one member of staff who said, "I have never worked somewhere that is so passionate about the families they support and the workers." The report also says that parents described the impact of the caring nature of the staff on them. One parent said "The staff are



friendly and don't judge you. They don't put pressure on you and if my child is having a meltdown, they are patient and wait for it to pass. They listen to my child and if my child wants to come home early, they will bring them home: but they do take the long way around, so we still get a break. Going the extra mile, literally.' Director Sally Bishop described the inspection results as phenomenal, "we are absolutely delighted" she said. "We have a great team of professional, committed and passionate support workers. They have gone the extra mile again and again during the pandemic, something greatly appreciated by families and social workers. I loved the bit in the report where one parent described how their child bounced and clapped with excitement when the support workers pull up in their car - absolutely brilliant!" Photo: Families have really appreciated the safe and creative outreach work done by ROC support workers during the pandemic - outstanding work, according to CQC.







We hope everyone who reads this gets at least some insight into what these beautiful creatures experience in the wild. At the moment all rescues admit hedgehogs that to the naked eye look ok, however this is certainly not the case,. I have seen some little ones come in with multi parasite burdens, they are very ill, dehydrated and sometimes close to death, I give constant critical care which means getting up through the night to check on them is a regular occurrence, it's very hard work and worrying too.

I want to thank finders for bringing hogs into rescue, I thank them because they have sought help for our precious, vulnerable hedgehogs that would have surely died in the wild. First Pat from Bluebell Close, she brought me two, regrettably only one survived, we have called her Belle, another baby hog picked up from the allotment, she is beautiful, very small and we have called her Charley, also here through the winter months, poorly at present but treatment making a difference, new hoggie mum steps in to assist, Denise, very much an animal and hedgehog lover. We are the best of friends. Can I also mention that if you try to kill vermin, rats etc using poisons, these also kill our hedgehogs, they can't be saved and, despite our best efforts, we fail. Slug pellets etc are frowned upon amongst us rehabbers. There are more organic ways to keep gardens free from pests, coffee grounds etc, Costa used to supply them upon request, ask again I am sure they won't mind. I have lots of people to thank, but I will do that next week. I hope you take the time to come and meet me on 27th November when our beautiful Christmas Tree Lights get switched on in the town centre. Fundraising is also something I need to do to keep these hedgehogs in over winter.

Last week started with spending some time in the constituency office and I was able to catch up with the members of my team based in Newton Aycliffe. We were able to discuss our plans for the coming weeks and particularly arrangements for Parliament Week, Remembrance Sunday and our Christmas card competition. Like last year, we are holding a competition open to local schools to design our Christmas card. Parliament Week is where we try to connect with different organisations to inform them more about the operations of Westminster and in particular the work of their MP. I have spoken to some schools and I will be in a meeting with the WI this week, but if you would like me to visit your organisation please write and let me know.

Last week I also had my monthly meeting with the senior management of Durham County Council. This is where I take the opportunity to raise issues that you have raised with me, that we are not seeing good progress on.

We were also looking at the details for our forthcoming surgeries at Ferryhill, Middleton St George, Woodham and Trimdon Grange. Please contact us at the email address below if you would like an appointment at any of these.

One issue you may have noticed in Parliament last week was the Owen Paterson affair. This was where we voted not to directly accept the recommendations of the Committee on Standards to suspend him for 30 days. This has been portrayed in the press as if we were trying to prevent Mr Paterson from facing the penalty he had been given, it was nothing of the sort. We voted to attempt to create a change that would have allowed him to be able to appeal, however the opposition parties then refused to engage with the proposed procedure. I find this strange as anyone else would have the right to appeal a sentence imposed. Having read the report, I have to say I was surprised he wanted to appeal, as it looked cut and dried to me and I could only see a worse outcome for him. My opinion is that if an MP is found guilty of being paid to lobby, then the consequences should be more than just a 30-day suspension, I believe they should at least face a by-election and preferably not be allowed to stand. Another issue that you may have seen would be the Environment Bill. This has had quite a bit of press for allegedly allowing the pollution of rivers by storm overflows. This is a fundamental misrepresentation of the

Bill, which in effect reduces the use of storm

overflows as well as improving water quality, promoting biodiversity and reducing the use of single use plastics.

Last week I referred to the COP26 event taking place in Glasgow, on Saturday I went to Sedgefield Parish Hall where Sedgefield Area Churches Together were holding a cafe COP to educate locals on some of the issues under debate and it was a pleasure to join them. Whilst COP26 is very important it is also critical that everyone can understand how their own actions can make an impact. After that I had the privilege of helping to sell poppies for the Royal British Legion, all the money raised goes to help those who gave service to us when it was needed. Remembrance Sunday is the second Sunday in November and this is associated to Armistice Day on the 11th of November which commemorates the day World War One ended, on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. One of my challenges as the MP for Sedgefield is that there are so many services that take place, often simultaneously. I will lay around 30 wreaths over the days from the 11th to the 14th of November. I will also attend several services including Middleton St George, Neasham, Trimdon Village, Durham Cathedral and Newton Aycliffe.

We still have Covid rates that are higher than we would like so can I please encourage you all to wear a mask when appropriate, test regularly and take advantage of whatever jabs you are offered. I hope to get my booster jab this week.

Championship swimming returned to England with the regional short course (25m pool) championships around the country. The Swim England North East region held their championships at Ponds Forge International Sports Centre in the centre of Sheffield. The pool there is one of only ten in the UK of international standard and numerous world records have been set there. Challenging qualifying times meant only the quickest swimmers can compete and over 70 clubs from across the North East and Yorkshire all sent their swimmers including

His 100m backstroke margin of victory was more than three seconds ahead of second place. He supplemented these with silvers in both 100m butterfly and 100m individual medley and also placed 6th in the 200m individual medley. . Filip managed to set new PB's in his five medal events. Not bad for your first regionals! Emma Price returned having competed in 2019 and took on eight events and set PB's in five of them totalling almost 26 seconds. Emma won bronze in 200m freestyle and then agonisingly took silver in 400m freestyle as she was pipped for gold by just three-hundredths of a second. She took 15 seconds off her 800m freestyle PB to win bronze and also swam 50m and 100m freestyle, 100m and 200m individual medley and 100m backstroke. The highlight
