Storm Arwen put paid to all but one of the Ebac Northern League fixtures last Saturday, including Newton Aycliffe's trip to Newcastle Benfield. That game has now been re-arranged for Wednesday 5th January.

Aycliffe welcomed Whitley Bay to the Beaumont Landscapes Stadium on Tuesday 30th November (7.45pm KO) with Seaham Red Star visiting on Saturday 4th December (KO 3pm).

The Newtonians have been reinstated into the Durham Challenge Cup. They were beaten by Darlington on penalties after a 2-2 draw in October. However, it was subsequently discovered that one of the visiting players was ineligible. Aycliffe will, therefore, now meet Esh Winning at home in the next round. That game is expected to take place on Tuesday 14th December.

New manager, Brian Atkinson, has begun making changes to his playing squad. Sonni Coleman has departed for Bishop Auckland while defender Liam McNamara has returned following a spell in Australia.

Sugar Hill Community Soup Kitchen Warms the Hearts of Local Community

For readers who recall our news story at the start of this term about our new and exciting curriculum at Sugar Hill we are so proud to share this news story with you about our Year 6 children and their project outcome. On Monday 29th & Tuesday 30th November Year 6 children from Sugar Hill Primary School hosted their own community soup kitchen outside the old Barclays Bank unit in Newton Aycliffe town centre. The children have spent much of the Autumn Term learning about human rights and how they are met in our local community. Throughout recent weeks, they have spent much of their time attempting to contact local businesses and charities in order to gain support for their community kitchen. The children used their literacy skills to write for a real purpose and enthusiastically wrote persuasive letters to Tesco, Costa, local greengrocers and Junction 7. Writing to these companies was a great way for the children to engage with local businesses and to develop an understanding of the support networks that exist within our local area. The community kitchen itself was an extremely rewarding day for the children and allowed them the opportunity to organise and deliver something that they had never had the chance to do before. They spent much of the morning cooking and preparing food - donated by our local Tesco store - in our community kitchen, ensuring that they could cater for as many people as possible with their soup and sandwiches. The event also gave the children the confidence to engage with members of the public and to strike up conversations about what they were doing and why. These are valuable life skills that we hope the children will continue to develop.

One attendee commented: "It's lovely to see young children engaging with their community in such a positive way." Another was incredibly complimentary of the children's work and was desperate to make a donation despite there being no charge for the food.

All in all, each afternoon was incredibly successful and the Year 6 children can be extremely proud of the work they put in to supporting members of their town. This event was supported by Russell Gibson, school governor, who commented that he could see that curriculum plans were coming to fruition and that the learning emphasised the children being at the heart of projects.

Mrs O'Rourke, Head Teacher, said, "I am incredibly proud of the work the children have completed throughout their project and the learning that has taken place this term. The children have developed skills and understanding around 21st Century issues within our local community that has broadened their knowledge of life beyond the classroom. It was lovely to see the children engage with members of the public and to hear so many compliments about Sugar Hill children. A huge thanks to local businesses who have supported staff and children with this project. Year 6 parents and carers will be coming into school next week where the children will showcase their learning and we are looking forward to this event in school."

Outstanding Times for ROC Group

CQC Outstanding for the fourth time in a row, Ofsted Outstanding in leadership and management and now winners of two 2021 regional Great British Care Awards - no wonder ROC Group is celebrating. Staff at the Newton Aycliffe based group were also highly commended in seven award categories, including Care Employer of the Year which they won in 2020.

The company delivers a range of services to vulnerable children, young people and families in Co. Durham and Teesside and employs over 140 people.

The first award was for their creative and robust response to Covid. The second was the Housing with Care Award - group directors Dot and Derek Butler had cofounded the thriving ROC Solid supported housing charity in 2007.

"We've have had an amazing year," said Dot. "Achieving CQC Outstanding again for the outreach and personal care work we do for children and young people who have complex needs was a real cause for celebration. Getting one is rare but we think four in a row could be a record!"

Their second children's home, The Hawthorns in Newton Aycliffe, has had its first full Ofsted inspection and was rated Overall Good and Outstanding in leadership and management.

"We're opening a third home soon for children and young people with health needs and we're aiming for Overall Outstanding at all three," said Dot.

The group delivers all the supported family time and complex needs outreach on behalf of Stockton Borough Council, complex needs outreach for Durham County Council and also has solo placement, extra supported houses for 16-18s in care transitioning to independence.

"We're really proud of the Housing with Care Award," said Dot. "Our staff team regularly go the extra mile to support some very vulnerable families and individuals."

As well as 50 two and three bedroom houses on estates in Newton Aycliffe, Stockton and Billingham, the charity has two centres staffed 24/7. Hope House in Newton Aycliffe includes a sought-after mother and baby unit and The Prison Reform Trust has cited its women-only, seven-bedroom centre in Billingham as an example of national good practice in helping women leaving prison. The care awards finals will be held at Birmingham IIC later this year.

Improving Facilities

As Woodham Academy continues to grow, it allows the school to invest in a programme of ongoing improvements in facilities. Woodham Academy strive to offer the best possible opportunities for the entire community, which are vital for both physical and mental well-

This half-term, the academy was delighted to open their brand new, state-of-the-art, fitness suite. This has taken months to develop to ensure the students can access a range of different gym equipment to further develop their understanding of health related fitness. Students can access the recently finished fitness suite during PE lessons and extracurricular sessions.

With extensive research and multiple designs, Woodham Academy are thrilled with the outcome. The £40,000 investment includes specialist equipment, with 21 cardio stations, along with floor space for body weight exercises. This allows for a full class to be active within a lesson. The room has been finished off with specialist gym flooring, full length mirrors spanning the walls and a 75inch smart TV. This completes the room making it an ideal space for KS3 Health Related Fitness lessons, BTEC Sport lessons and a recreational space for students and staff.

Mr Bell, Headteacher, is delighted with the end product "The fitness suite has been a work in progress for a number of months. It comes off the back of creating a brand new food room, which then created the space for this development. West Terrace, Aycliffe Village) (Temporary Road Closure) Order 2021

The Council on 26/11/21 made the above Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 as amended, Section 14 (1) to prohibit all vehicular traffic from proceeding on 70 metres of West Terrace that extends eastwards from its junction with A167, Aycliffe Village to enable new drainage connection works to be undertaken. Alternative route from the western side of the closure from A167 north and turning south easterly onto Durham Road leading to The Green and West Terrace to the eastern side of the closure, and vice versa. Closing down Banks is not a good starting point, also DCC want your views on the regeneration of the Town Centre but if you don't have access to a computer then that idea will be futile.







NAFC Appoint New Manager

Newton Aycliffe Football Club are delighted to confirm the appointment of Brian Atkinson as the club's new manager.

Brian returns to the Beaumont Landscapes Stadium 10 years after departing the club where he formed part of Allan Oliver's coaching team.

Brian spent five years at the Beaumont Landscapes Stadium and played a huge role in the



Brian, 50, brings a wealth of knowledge to the football club both as an ex-player of Sunderland, Carlisle United and Darlington, and as an assistant manager at Spennymoor Town, Darlington and West Auckland Town.

Brian spent seven years on Wearside and made over 170 appearances in all competitions, including the 1992 FA Cup final against Liverpool, before a brief loan spell with Carlisle in 1996. The midfielder would move to Darlington later that year where he would remain for the rest of his playing career featuring over 200 times for the Quakers.

When Brian's five year coaching spell with Aycliffe came to an end in October 2011 he joined Spennymoor as assistant manager in February 2012 before returning to Darlington in the same role three months later.

After several years with Darlington, and a stint with York City as an analyst, Brian returned to the Northern League as assistant manager once more at the Wanted Stadium with West Auckland in 2018, a position he held until this year.

Brian has a wealth of coaching experience beyond his roles as assistant including work with Darlington's Centre of Excellence and the Martin Gray Football Academy.

And speaking on his return to the Beaumont Landscapes Stadium Brian said: "I'm looking forward to it. I've been out of senior football since I left West Auckland.

"I'm looking forward to stepping up. I feel like I've done my apprenticeship because I've been a number two – I've done that more than enough now. I've done it at Darlington, I've done it at Spennymoor, Aycliffe and at West Auckland, so I feel like I'm ready. "Of course I've got great memories of the club and my time here," he added.

"It feels like I'm coming home. I'm from Aycliffe and I used to know Allan quite well and Danny [Mellanby] and all the committee really. So I'm just really looking forward to getting started."

Club Chairman, Allan Oliver, said: "I'm delighted to welcome Brian to the club.

"It's his first time as a number one but there are no concerns whatsoever, none at all. He's experienced enough in the league to know what being a number one is.

"He knows the club. He's been here before. I think he'll put smiles on the faces of the players. I think they'll enjoy playing for him because he's been there and done it himself.

"My relationship with him made it easier, of course, but I know he's calm and has great knowledge of the game and I'm looking forward to working with him again.

"We've got a good group of lads and we need to start on Friday night and go from there."

Brian will take charge of his first game when Newton Aycliffe travel to the First Mortgage Glebe Sports Ground to take on Whickham on Friday night with kick-off at 7.30pm.

New Cycle and Walking Route Funded



Work has begun on a new travel route in Newton Aycliffe to provide better facilities for pedestrians, wheelchair and pushchair users and cyclists.

Durham County Council is building the new route alongside the A167, using money allocated from the government's Active Travel Fund.

In May 2020, the government announced £2 billion of funding for walking and cycling, to help seize the once in a generation opportunity to change the way that people travel in response to the Covid pandemic.

The Active Travel Fund was divided into two tranches. Nationally, £250 million was allocated in Tranche 1 to be spent on swiftly delivered emergency measures to provide more space for walking and cycling. Durham County Council received a £392,999 allocation from this first portion of the fund, which it spent on improvements including protected cycle lanes, reduced speed limits, enhanced bridleways and resurfacing work.

In the second tranche of funding, the council was awarded £650,000 to create an active travel corridor in Newton Aycliffe.

The new two-kilometre route will link Moore Lane and Aycliffe Village, via St Cuthbert's Way, and will include a wider footway for pedestrians, as well as a separate new two-way cycle lane. On completion, the scheme will become part of the Great North Cycleway, a long-distance route linking Blyth to Darlington. The route, which is due to be complete by spring 2022, will also link up with other travel schemes in the future, to create a more comprehensive active travel network across the region. In February 2021, residents, businesses and visitors were encouraged to have their say on plans for the scheme. Eighty-six per cent of people who responded to the consultation said that they either strongly agreed or agreed with the proposals.

Cllr Elizabeth Scott, the council's Cabinet member for economy and partnerships, said: "During the restrictions of Covid, travelling on foot and by bike became popular options for a lot of people. We want to encourage all the people who have been walking, running and cycling during the lockdowns to continue to do so, as well as

encouraging new people to take part.

"The new Newton Aycliffe travel corridor will help people to walk and cycle to work, school, to do their shopping or to take exercise, which will in turn improve their health. Choosing to cycle or walk instead of driving, will also reduce traffic congestion and pollution, as well as reducing people's carbon footprint, so the scheme has many benefits.

Last week I spoke at the PlaceShapers Annual Conference, a virtual event via Zoom, where I particularly discussed the levelling up agenda and the efforts of both the APPG for Left Behind Neighbourhoods and others. The work here is around how important the place you live in is and the need to enable people to have pride in it. I also supported initiatives around Down's syndrome and removing anonymity from social media accounts.

In the House of Commons I was able to ask a question on Women & Equalities relating to tenancy succession rights for women that, I have been told, are discriminatory. I also asked a question in the Urgent Questions on rail for the north where I want to know how we can move the Leamside project forward. There has been some misleading press on this and Ferryhill Station. Leamside needs progressing differently but Ferryhill remains very much on track. The major news this week, of course, is the emergence of the Omicron variant of Covid-19, first detected in South Africa. This has thankfully been detected and communicated early and gives the best chance of it being managed. I have already seen emails both questioning why we are slow to react and describing what we have done as an overreaction! As regards to why information and guidance was announced on Saturday but not effective until Tuesday, this is because it could not be enacted as law until Monday when Parliament was in session so Tuesday was the earliest it could be implemented. In terms of whether it is an overreaction, the significant impact for most of us is only the increased use of masks. Whilst I am questioned about the science behind their use, and I am not an expert to answer that, what I would say is that for most of us wearing a mask when we travel or go into shops is certainly not going to harm us and if there is even a possibility that this helps restrict the spread then for me it is worth doing. The biggest inconvenience is for international arrivals where it will be required for you to isolate until you have a negative PCR test, this concerns me a little and I would have preferred that even if the PCR test is mandatory a negative lateral flow could have removed the need to isolate whilst waiting for the result.

What seems to be increasingly clear though is, that the roll out of vaccines to the most vulnerable first, and their subsequent earlier second jabs and boosters is proving to be the best strategy for saving lives. Whilst we have high infection rates the number hospitalised or seriously ill is mercifully low. I also understand that the proportion of those that are ill, who have not had the vaccine, is disproportionately high, which reinforces further the value in getting your jab. Please, if you have not had yours yet or are due another please sort it and give us all the best chance of a more normal Christmas this year.


