# Royal Mail Post Backlog Woodham Academy Raise

Dear Sir,

I would like to make your readers aware of a problem with Royal Mail deliveries in the Byerley Park Area.

I was expecting two important deliveries last week (a wedding card with a cheque enclosed and a P45) and neither item was delivered. When I realised that I had actually not had any deliveries at all during the week commencing Monday 29th November, I contacted Royal Mail on Monday 6th December to ask them to investigate and a case was opened. This morning, as I was not working, I decided to go to the sorting office and ask if I had any mail. I was then presented with eleven items of mail which included the two items I was expecting last week. When I asked why my mail was being withheld, I was advised that it wasn't being withheld, but they have nobody to deliver it! How long this situation is expected to continue for is anyone's guess! The wedding card and cheque were sent by my elderly aunt, and because she was worried that the cheque may have got into the wrong hands, cancelled it with the bank on 6 December at a cost of £10.00. She has had to pay for two cards, two lots of postage plus £10 to cancel the cheque - all because Royal Mail have failed to deliver. The other item, which I was expecting last week, was a P45 which was required for a new employer on Monday 6th December. I have been in touch with Royal Mail regarding compensation and was told NO - I cannot claim compensation. When I questioned this, I was then told that compensation can only be claimed by the sender. This puts the onus on my 83 year old aunt, who has already been inconvenienced with another trip to the card shop, the bank and the post office.

I think it is completely unacceptable that Royal Mail have chosen to withhold mail from the residents of Byerley Park for the last eight working days. Why have they not re-deployed an employee from another round for one or two days, just to ensure that at least some of the mail is still delivered here? Some areas of the town will be receiving their mail as normal but we are receiving none. I would like to hear what the manager of the local sorting office has

got to say about this.
Update: It appears that the Royal Mail have delivered the backlog of mail as my neighbour has just received eight days worth of mail (on Tuesday afternoon) but we still don't know if this situation will arise



# Waste Incinerator Plans Rejected by Council

Local Councillors in Great Aycliffe are celebrating after a plan to build an incinerator in the town were thrown out by the County Council's planning committee.

Lib Dem Councillor, Michael Stead, (Aycliffe North & Middridge), spoke at the meeting and recommended reasons for refusal which the committee eventually supported.



He explained, "We had to stop this application. It would have damaged the future prosperity of our town, using two hectares of land to build a polluting incinerator but providing only 27 jobs. This site is right next to Hitachi and has the potential to offer hundreds of jobs. I'm delighted the committee listened to my objections and those of other councillors."

Independent Councillor, Ken Robson, (Aycliffe East), also spoke at the County Planning Committee saying, "As a proud nimby and local Councillor I would like to say that no one in my locality is in favour of this plant, and in fact many are in dread of the toxic emissions which they perceive may be allowed to enter the atmosphere and environment. As a result of the burning of medical and toxic waste." Lib Dem Councillor, Nev Jones, also spoke at the meeting saying, "The plant plans to dispose of medical and hazardous waste by incineration on a 24 hour schedule and with initially 30 visits a day delivering between 6am and 10pm. You will have light pollution from lit bays and vehicle headlights. You will have a shocking great 30 metre chimney visible for miles, and there's the smell."

Cllr Jones added, "This plant is offering 27 new jobs. This is a fairly paltry return for the massive loss of amenity residents will suffer. I do wonder if southern based business (Norfolk in this case) think that my residents will put up with anything in return for employment." It was the issues around the use of the Business Park and the risk to other businesses which eventually led to the rejection of the application in the committee.

Lib Dem Councillor, Craig Martin, a committee member, commented, "I want development on our industrial estates and more jobs but I have to question if this is an acceptable use of the land on this Business Park. We heard the comments from Hitachi, one of the jewels in the crown of employment in the last ten years in this area, we have objections here from them stating that this could harm their work."

He went on to say, "Changes to the planning rules state that incineration cannot be classified as B2. So we have a Business Park with B2 use. The government has said that you cannot attach incineration on to B2. And so, I recommend refusal as this Business Park is not suitable for an incinerator as per Policy 2, [of the County Durham Plan]."

Councillor Patricia Jopling, (Crook), seconded the motion to refuse the incinerator. One of two Labour Councillors in attendance at the committee supported the incinerator.

Councillor David Boyes, from Easington, commented, "I can't see a great deal to object about this, so I'm going to support the planning officers recommendation for approval."

Five Labour Councillors on the committee did not attend the meeting or provide substitutes. Every other Councillor on the committee voted against the application.

After the meeting Councillor Stead commented, "I'm delighted this dirty incinerator application has been thrown out. However I'm also rather concerned that so many Labour Councillors on the committee didn't show up."

# **RUNNING CLUB NEWS**

Saturday morning saw the return of parkrun to the North-East, after most events were wiped out by Storm Arwen last week. Members turned out at events held at Darlington South Park, Hackworth, Keswick, Sedgefield, York and Marshall Drive in Brotton, near Saltburn, There were no significant milestones achieved this week perhaps everyone was keeping their powder dry for the latest cross-country race later in the weekend.

There was also a 5K race taking place on Saturday morning, as the Darlington Harriers and Athletics Club hosted their annual race at the Croft Motor Circuit. Carley Cooper was the only Member of the Club to take part in the race, finishing her run in 26:02. Elsewhere on Saturday morning, Sandra Rudd was taking on the York Yuletide Trail race, hosted by See York Run York. Unfortunately, the original course had to be rerouted on the day due to a 'bovine-related incident'. Unperturbed by this last-minute change, Sandra completed the race in 1:04:43, and was rewarded with a medal and plenty of chocolate for her trouble! Sunday morning saw the latest races being held at the Dalton Park Retail Outlet. Hosted by Run Durham, a 5K and 10K option was available. Ian Stothard took on the Dalton Park Winter 5K, completing the race in 32:54. Taking part in the Dalton Park Winter 10K race, David Stothard crossed the line in 1:00:18.

On Sunday afternoon the latest cross-country (XC) fixture in the North Yorkshire and South Durham (NYSD) League took place at Summerhill Country Park in Hartlepool. Inclement conditions prior to the races ensured a suitably challenging cross-country course. Kelly Dickinson was the Club's sole female representative in the Ladies Race and completed the 4.6K course in a time of 28:01. In the Over 65 Veteran Men's race, which took place over the same distance, Trevor Needham was the second runner home overall, crossing the line in 21:41. Kevin Greenall had a good run in the Over 70 Veteran Men's race, also over 4.6K, finishing in third place overall in a time of 26:36.

In the Senior and Veteran Men's race, which took place over 8.9K, Club Captain John Firby secured a top ten finish (8th) crossing the line in 35:52. # **Cracking Competition** for Swimmers



Sedgefield 75 swimming club headed to Stanley last weekend for a festive gala hosted by Derwentside swimming club titled the Christmas Cracker Meet.

Seven swimmers competed for medals and chocolate as Derwentside continued their tradition of awarding a selection box to the winner of every heat. It proved a great motivation as the swimmers returned 26 personal bests out of 36 swims including some staggering performances.

Evie Weston swam five races setting two PB's including more than seventeen seconds taken from her 200 backstroke best. She also came away with gold in 100m butterfly and bronze in that 200m backstroke.

Zoe Hodgson came home with a lot of chocolate and a superb eight out of eight PB's which included over six seconds off her 100m breaststroke best and almost sixteen seconds from her 200m individual medley best which was only set in June this year. Charlotte Lee swam two breaststroke events and 50m free and took silver in 200m breaststroke.

Ellis Dickinson found a new level as he swam six races in six big PB's, most impressive being seventeen seconds in 100m freestyle, twenty-three seconds in 50m butterfly and more than twenty-eight seconds in 100m breaststroke. In terms of magnitude of personal bests, one of the most astounding performances the club has seen. Filip Wilczynski continued where he left off from Sheffield recently and won six out of six gold medals setting three new PB's including six seconds off his 100m freestyle best and three from his 50m breaststroke.

Oliver Turnbull swam three new PB's from five, those being 50m backstroke, 50m freestyle and 200m freestyle.

Charlie McEwan got three out of four PB's in 50m backstroke and butterfly, and 100m freestyle.

On the same Saturday, 13-year-old Emma Price headed back to Sheffield to take part in her first English National swimming championships, competing as a junior against the country's best sixteen-year-olds and younger. Emma had made the qualifying time for 400m freestyle at the recent regional championships at the same Ponds Forge International Swimming Centre in Sheffield.

The open (adult) championships ran concurrently and the swimmers mixed in the same heats seeded on qualifying times only. This meant that Emma was competing in the same event as international and Olympic swimmers including Abbie Wood, also swimming 400m freestyle, who had finished 4th at Tokyo 2020 in 200m individual medley this summer. A fantastic experience and it surely won't be her

#### Here is your weekly update from the Team at Newton Aycliffe.

Firstly, we are pleased to announce that our first rapid deployment CCTV camera has been installed in Western area of the town to help us tackle antisocial behaviour. This was following a lot of hard work by members of the team and joint working with local Councillors.

As their name suggests, these cameras can be installed in a timely manner in areas which are identified as hotspots. The quality of these



cameras are second to none and will allow us to identify offenders and gather evidence to use in criminal and civil proceedings. Patrols have been conducted outside of local schools at 'picking up and dropping off' times to target motorists who park in restricted areas. Whilst we appreciate parents will often have a morning rush, inconsiderate parking puts children at risk so please think before you park.

Officers joined Councillors and partners from Durham County Council for a walkabout in the Woodham area. This was looking at local issues and working together to resolve them and will be happening in other areas of the town.

The carousel training resumed again this week, this time at Stephenson Way Junior School. This was educating children in years 5 and 6 around issues including internet safety, bullying, antisocial behaviour and crime & consequences. The children were all receptive and their reward was a visit from Police dogs Jet and Ben. Officers have been creating and submitting files to be presented to the Crown Prosecution Service for a number of youths who are suspected of committing offences in local area. Again, this is ongoing work to combat the problems caused by a small number of youths.

On a final note, please take the necessary steps to safeguard your homes and belongings on these dark winters nights. # **HAVE YOU GOT**

This week's column needs to start with a discussion around the latest Covid restrictions, as I am sure you are all aware these changed last week. There were high profile changes to international travel rules with the introduction of both pre departure lateral flow tests and on arrival PCR tests for everyone coming into the UK. This will affect a relatively small number of people significantly but for most of us it is the change to mask rules that will impact us. This change is a small imposition but one that affects many people. I know that some of you disagree with the need and the value of wearing a mask for shopping or travelling but, as I have said before, it is a small inconvenience and if there is any chance it could help then why not?

Even if you fundamentally disagree with mask wearing, one thing that is definitely not acceptable is abusing our front-line shop workers, bus drivers etc. for trying to enforce the rules. It is their job; they have no choice. If you want to rant off about it then do it to me, it's my Government that have imposed these rules not the person behind the counter or driving the bus. If you don't want to wear a mask in a shop then don't go in, shop online or ask a friend. Unfortunately, I have had a number of people writing to me who have been abused in this way and I would implore everyone to refrain and also if you see it happening, support the staff.

Obviously, a significant impact has been felt locally by Storm Arwen, this has been devastating for many people particularly in Weardale and Teesdale but also in places like Barmpton village, Thornley and Easington. There is enormous credit due to the front-line teams dealing with this, particularly given the scale and the weather they had to deal with. There are however some serious questions to be answered as regards the infrastructure investment and the communications to those affected. My week in Westminster included briefings on the storm and a debate in the chamber on the response. I had a meeting with the BEIS ministers about their immediate plans and activities. For BEIS I also had a select committee session, this week was quite technical and was about State Aid and Post Brexit Competition Policy and in particular the roles of different bodies in monitoring or enforcing the rules. I joined a meeting of the APPG trying to get justice for Equitable Life policyholders and I chaired the latest evidence session for my APPG on Left Behind Neighbourhoods. This session was titled Cleaner, Safer, Greener? Livability in Left Behind Neighbourhoods. We had

witnesses reinforcing the studies behind how important your local environment is to quality of life, whether this is access to green spaces or indeed blue spaces (by this they meant the sea, lakes or rivers) but importantly the quality and cleanliness of these spaces. I also had meetings in Westminster on subjects including Aviation, Asylum Seekers, Dormant Assets and Ocean Conservation.

Before heading north on Wednesday night, I was able to meet Penny Mordaunt, Minister of State for Trade Policy, to promote our local businesses, in particular NETPark, Kromek and Crafters Companion. Penny is going to the United States soon, so I wanted to share our US facing businesses. Back in the constituency I was able to catch up with my team and the daily issues we continue to deal with. I met several businesses and was able to pop into Woodham Community Centre where the local Councillors, David Sutton Lloyd and Tony Stubbs, were coordinating a multi-agency walkabout. Huge credit to those operating this process as I was able to book a test at the drive in at Shildon on Saturday morning and had confirmation I was negative by Saturday afternoon.

My sign off message remains boringly consistent, our biggest weapon against Covid is the vaccines, everything I hear tells me that the countries with highest vaccination rates are faring best and also that those in hospital with Covid are disproportionately those who have not been vaccinated. 

# **Winter Crime Prevention**

Burglaries often increase during the autumn and winter months, as burglars take advantage of the longer hours of darkness and target unlit homes.

Crime prevention doesn't have to cost a lot of money, there are simple measures you can take to make your home look occupied and reduce your chances of being a victim.

- Always keep doors and windows locked, even when you're in. Remove the keys from the lock and keep them out of view or reach.
- Install LED dusk to dawn lighting to make sure that your garden, especially doorways, are well lit at night.
- If you are away from home, make your house look occupied, use a timer switch to operate lamps or a TV simulator and leave a radio on.
- Secure bins at night and put garden furniture away for the winter as these can be used by burglars as climbing aids to gain access to upper floor windows.
- Lock your garden gates and side entrances using strong closed shackle padlocks to BS EN 12320 standard.
- Never leave a spare key in a convenient hiding place, such as under the doormat or in a flowerpot.
- Marked property can deter burglars because it is harder for a thief to sell on. Any valuable items should be marked, either using an etching type tool to mark the post code, or by using a UV pen or property marking products that fluoresce under UV light.
- Join our free messaging service Keep in the Know and consider following your neighbourhood policing teams on Facebook to keep up to date with what's happening in your area and what is being done about it.

The visitors pressed for the equaliser, even pushing goalkeeper Patton up to be a presence in the Aycliffe box while Seaham had back to back corners. While the visitors pushed it wasn't all one way traffic and Aycliffe had chances of their own to extend the lead, most notably when Man of the

The final whistle signalled a second win in a row for manager Brian Atkinson with his side scoring 11 goals in a week.
