Lifestyle Fitness Toy Appeal Donate Your Christmas **Tree to Support Hospice**

Residents in Newton Aycliffe will, next month, have the opportunity to easily dispose of their used Christmas trees and, at the same time, support one of the region's most valued hospices. Over the weekend of Saturday 8th and Sunday 9th January volunteers from Darlington Rotary Club will tour the area collecting any size of tree from households and have it recycled into usable products. In return the homeowner donates a small sum to

"This is a win-win venture all round," said rotary club organiser David Hayward, "Residents avoid the mess and fuss of tree disposals and the hospice benefits from much needed funds."

Armed with a fleet of 20 large vans and 70 volunteers, the rotary club hopes, over the weekend, to collect around 1700 trees from the Darlington and Newton Aycliffe area and generate over £13,000 for

"Over the decade we have been offering this service we have collected, on average, around 80 trees every year from the Newton Aycliffe area alone," said Mr. Hayward. "Residents have proved to be very willing and generous participants."

Vans are being loaned free from Darlington Council, plus rental companies Enterprise and Charter. The venture is hosted by Drive Vauxhall, with Darlington's John Wade recycling centre, and tree surgeon Greenworx, converting the trees into fertilizer or biomass

APPLICATION OF THE DESIGNATION

- 5. This designation applies to any house which is let or occupied under a tenancy or licence within the area described in paragraph 4 unless
 - (a) The house is a house in multiple occupation and is required to be licensed under Part 2 of the Act;
 - (b) The tenancy or licence of the house has been granted by a registered social landlord;

- (c) The house is subject to an Interim or Final Management Order under Part 4 of the Act;
- (d) The house is subject to a temporary exemption under section 86 of the Act; or
- (e) The house is occupied under a tenancy or licence which is exempt under the Act or the occupation is of a building or part of a building so exempt as defined in The Selective Licensing of Houses (Specified Exemptions)(England) Order 2006 SI 2006/370.

EFFECT OF THE DESIGNATION

- 6. Subject to sub paragraphs 5(a) to (e) every house in the area specified in paragraph 4 that is occupied under a tenancy or licence shall be required to be licensed under section 85 of the Act
- 7. The County Council of Durham will comply with the notification requirements contained in section 83 of the Act and shall maintain a register of all houses registered under this designation, as required under section 232 of the Act

CONSEQUENCES OF FAILING TO LICENCE A PROPERTY THAT IS REQUIRED TO BE LICENSED.

- 8. Upon the Designation coming into force any person who operates a licensable property without a licence or allows a licensed property to be occupied by more households or persons other than as authorised by the licence, is, pursuant to the provisions of Section 95(1) of the Act, liable to prosecution (and upon summary conviction to an unlimited fine), or a financial penalty not exceeding £30,000.
- 9. A person who breaches a condition of a licence shall either be liable to prosecution (and upon summary conviction to an unlimited fine), or a financial penalty not exceeding £30,000 10. Operating an unlicensed property may also lead to the Council, or a tenant, making an application to the First-tier Tribunal to obtain a Rent Repayment Order in respect of up to 12 months' rent or housing benefit monies paid.
- 11. The Council is also empowered to take control of unlicensed premises by making an Interim Management Order.
- 12. Furthermore, in relation to shorthold tenancies, no Section 21 notice may be served under the Housing Act 1988 in respect of an unlicensed property.







What is Town Council Doing About Climate Change?

Dear Sir

As many of you know, I resigned from Great Aycliffe Town Council last month. I had intended to resign next year when my wife and I moved house, but the sad death of Brian Hall forced a by-election in my ward, so I resigned early so that both seats could be decided at the same election (which they were last week) and thus save the Council money.

This left one loose end to tie up, which I had been waiting on the conclusion of COP26 to raise, which was seeking an update on the Town Council's progress on the climate emergency, which it had acknowledged in 2019.

I therefore raised the following issues last week as a member of the public:

1. What is the Town Council currently doing as regards climate impact?

2. What is being done to prepare a Climate Plan?

THE TOWN CLERK ANSWERS:

Of course I already knew the answer to Q1! GATC has been ahead of the game in this area for decades, and the Town Clerk was able to give a detailed account of the Council's significant achievements. On the second issue, however, he was more cautious. Covid and the May election (and change of administration) had delayed progress, and no formal Plan or Policy

had been prepared. Moreover, given staff workload pressures, neither could he foresee rapid progress on the preparation of such a Plan in the near future. He suggested the possibility of establishing a Climate Change Reserve in the next budget, and shared that the local larger town councils were talking about maybe employing a Climate Change Officer jointly.

THE COUNCILLORS' DISCUSSION: In the ensuing discussion, Cllr Eddy Adam declared the issue "something that we cannot avoid", and linked it to the ecological emergency and the 2021 Environment Act. Cllr Jed Hillary asked for a report to be brought back to Council.

Apart from Cllr Tony Armstrong, however, who welcomed the opportunity for jointworking, the ruling administration remained silent, which was a bit worrying.

FUTURE PROGRESS:

However, I have done all I can, and this issue is now a matter for the Town Councillors. Residents on the town may wish to keep up the pressure on GATC to 'do its bit' - not just for mitigation measures, but perhaps even more urgently for proactive adaptation, so that residents are not caught unprepared by the warming climate and increased extreme weather events.

Well, unbelievably, two years have passed since I had the privilege of being elected your Member of Parliament. Thursday was an amazing day, it started with a trip to Fishburn Primary School to thank them for designing my Christmas card, followed by joining an online seminar

with the innovative businesses on NETPark before topping the day off at Hitachi. As I am sure you have all seen, Hitachi have been awarded the £2Billion rolling stock contract for HS2. This is an incredible boost for the facility and a huge vote of confidence in Newton Avcliffe.

I hope this is the start of more good news as we hopefully come out of Covid through 2022. So, to finish, please get your jab or booster, follow the rules and let's hope for a better new year.
