The GAMP Project Callout is now OPEN

The Great Aycliffe & Middridge Partnership (GAMP) Board has a budget of £144k available, and applications are invited for projects from community & voluntary or notfor-profit organisations and groups. Grants of between £5,000 - £20,000 are available for project applications which support our key 'Community Recovery' priority. Important: anyone applying for a project over £15,000 MUST have a minimum of £10,000 capital expenditure included in the project.

Prospective projects must take place in the GAMP area.

Our focus this year will be on an overarching 'Community Recovery' priority theme, and projects should aim to address at least one of the following key issues:

- **Employability initiatives**
- Advice and Guidance
- Mental Health & Wellbeing
- Organisational sustainability
- Food provision and support
- Social Isolation
- Support for the Voluntary and Community Sector
- Tackling antisocial behaviour
- Support to small businesses (through a third party, not-for-profit organisation to complement existing DCC and external opportunities)
- **Emerging Community Issues**
- Targeting Older Peoples Social Isolation (A proportion of the available funding is aimed at specifically supporting communityled initiatives that improve outcomes for older people who are socially isolated, and encourage participation in activities and projects that provide opportunities for them to contribute positively to their local communities. For the purposes of this fund an older person is someone over the age of 50 years.)

Groups are permitted to apply for more than one grant, so long as one funding allocation is not reliant on another.

Applications can be submitted for either capital or revenue funding (or both), and projects which include a specific element of capital spend are encouraged. If you need advice on the specific definitions for capital/revenue, please get in touch. Project proposals must also include a minimum of 5% match funding (either cash or in-kind, or

All eligible applications will be assessed and ranked by a panel of GAMP Board members, to determine which projects will be awarded funding. Prospective projects should have a planned start date no earlier than November 2022 to allow time for the appraisal process.

Aycliffe Cricket Club Scoreboard Report



Newton Aycliffe Cricket Club's 1st team, sponsored by Franks the Flooring Store, continued their winless start to the season with a 100 run defeat away at Stokesley 2nd XI who currently sit bottom of the NYSD 2nd division table. The home side opted to bat first and scored an impregnable 279 for 9 in their allotted 50 overs. Luke Telford (sponsored by Mal and Jean Pattinson) deserves credit for bowling a marathon 15 overs in such difficult circumstances, finishing with the respectable figures of 3 for 58 and he received good support from James Layfield-Carroll (2 for 33) and Adam Gittins (2 for 50). In reply, a number of Aycliffe batsman made good starts, but unfortunately none of them went on to convert it into the much needed bigger score. Captain Chris Palmer top scored with 25 off 34 balls and other contributions came from George Slatcher (22 off 37 balls), Luke Telford (21 off 25 balls) and Dan Weldon (17 off 22 balls) as their side were eventually bowled out for 179 from 38 overs.

The 2nd team had a difficult afternoon when they hosted promotion hopefuls Billingham Synthonia 2nd XI and were well beaten by 124 runs in their NYSD 4th division game. The visitors opted to bat first and piled up a match winning 229 for 3 declared after 34 overs. In reply, 15 year old Aycliffe stand in captain Tom Dearden (sponsored by Kevin Burton) top scored with a patient score of 23 from 80 balls. The only other batsmen to reach double figures were Jai Sander (14 runs from 45 balls), Adam Shaw (14 runs from 14 balls) and Harrison Pearson (13 runs from 22 balls) as Aycliffe were eventually bowled out for 105 after 36.4 overs.

The u17's began their season with a battling performance at home to Hartlepool in the NYSD cup and were eventually beaten by just 8 runs. The visitors batted first and scored 116 for 5 in their allotted 20 overs with Owen Smith (2 for 16) and Ramzan Hussain (2 for 19) the pick of the bowlers. In reply, Aycliffe were struggling at 45 for 5 despite some resistance from Matty Greaves (15 runs) and Jai Sander (13 runs). However the tail fought back superbly and a club record 8th wicket partnership of 36 between Daniel Heaton, who top scored with 19 runs and Leo Stout 11 runs, and a quickfire 13 from Adam Shaw, nearly won it for Aycliffe in a tense finale, but they were eventually bowled out for 108 with just 3 balls of the innings remaining.

The club's u15's team put in another superb performance, this time to beat Darlington at home by 100 runs in the NYACC and setting a new u15's club record for the largest victory margin. Batting first Aycliffe scored a huge 191 for 3 in their allotted 20 overs and this was another u15's club record for the highest innings total thanks to some brilliant batting by captain Tom Dearden (53 retired off 34 balls), Harrison Pearson (50 retired off 30 balls) and an unbeaten 29 off 19 balls by Leo Stout. In reply, the visitors were restricted to 91 for 3 from 20 overs with Tom Norman, Dan Heaton and Leo Stout each taking one wicket.

On Sunday, 15th May, the club hosted its first senior ladies cricket festival of the season involving teams from Newton Aycliffe, Castle Eden, Sacriston, Sunderland and two teams from Beamish Cricket Clubs. The event was a big success and all the players had a very enjoyable afternoon.



Is the Highway Code Law?



The government says that many of the rules in the Code are legal requirements, and if you disobey these rules you are committing a criminal offence.

The Highway Code alone is not a legal document and the rules outlined in it are not official road laws, but that doesn't mean you can't be fined if you break one of the 307 regulations set out in the Government-issued book.

A number of the points outlined in the Code are backed up by official traffic laws, meaning you can be fined, prosecuted or disqualified if you ignore them.

For example, if you're found guilty of causing death by dangerous driving, the maximum penalty is 14 years' prison and an "unlimited fine."

Rule 242: You MUST NOT leave your vehicle or trailer in a dangerous position or where it causes any unnecessary obstruction of the road. (Laws RTA 1988, sect 22 & CUR reg 103).

Rule 243: DO NOT stop or park opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space. DO NOT stop or park on a bend.

The photographs shown were taken on a typical Sunday morning outside the Bethany Centre on Woodham Way, clearly showing drivers disregard for other road users and the Highway Code.

I ask that these drivers find alternative parking nearby, for example the disused car park at the rear of the now closed Huntsman Pub, before a serious accident occurs due to restricted views of oncoming vehicles. Repeat offender's details will be noted and passed to relevant authorities.

Arriva Bus Service

Dear Sir

Picking up on Tony Knight's letter, from a previous edition. Sorry to hear about all the trouble he has had with the no. 7 Arriva bus service.

At first, and still ongoing at times, Arriva, as with others, have had two key problems. 1) Covid, both getting it and/or being in contact with people who have it, has had an impact on drivers.

2) Worldwide lorry driver shortages has led to many bus drivers leaving to go to drive lorries, in some cases getting paid twice as much. The no. 7 had recently reduced its frequency to try and off set this. Although back up to four an hour. Due to this service, intended as a more frequent service, it is easier to take drivers from this service to put them in less frequent services, say only hourly etc. While these are having an impact day to day as to how many drivers can come in etc, we, of course, feel the impact.

Looking ahead, County Durham (possibly Darlington?) are looking to introduce a new system late this year or maybe early next year. It will be large E-Boards/bus stop posters to replace the normal bus stop posters. They will be able to show more real time info, along with intended service info. Also, if a bus is cancelled this should also be displayed. Therefore, hopefully, when it comes and, hopefully, having the ability to inform every bus stop with these along the route, we should get a better idea of what's going on. I certainly am looking forward to these changes.

of poetry workshops including having an opportunity to perform on the stage at The Globe.



As I said last week, on Tuesday, I had the privilege of being in the House of Lords for the Queen's Speech. This is a very special occasion on two levels. It is of course a critical part of our democratic process where the Queen communicates the legislative programme for the next session. However, for most people this is recognised as one of the fantastic Royal ceremonial events we do so well and to be sat right in the heart of this, in a seat facing Prince Charles, was just amazing. On the following day I had an invitation to the Royal Garden Party at Buckingham Palace which made it a week I will never forget. The weather did not really co-operate, but it was still great to be there. In the Chamber debates took place on the Queen's speech for five days, two last week and three this week. Each day has a nominal theme for the day but there is quite a bit of latitude to cross subjects over days. The themes given were: Preventing Crime and Delivering Justice; Fairness at Work, Power in Communities; Making Britain the Best Place to Grow Up and Grow Old; Tackling Short-term and Long-term Cost of Living Increases and finally, on Wednesday, Achieving Economic Growth.

On return from Westminster last week, I visited Fishburn Parish Council, I had joined a number of their Teams meetings during the worst of the pandemic, but it was a pleasure to be able to call in physically. I also had the delight of visiting a farm near Little Stainton which is a mixed arable and livestock farm. I was joined by members of the local NFU and we discussed farming policy and it was both informative and uplifting to be in the countryside as a contrast to central London. I had the opportunity to talk with one of our Clinical Directors to get their perspective on changes to Clinical Commissioning Groups. On Friday, I also had a meeting with the Friends of the Stockton and Darlington Railway as regards the 2025 Bicentennial plans and their hopes to rejuvenate the site of the Locomotion Pub, where the first trains on the route were assembled two centuries ago. I also caught up with Durham County Council as regards both Levelling Up and the bid for County Durham to be City of Culture, as well as talking to the Conservative Women's Organisation.

In response to a criticism in last week's Newton News about my support for the slightly reduced speed limit on the A167 from Aycliffe Village to the Industrial Estate. I really don't see why anyone would be concerned about travelling the road at the reduced top speed instead of the old one, approximately ½ mile. It will now take around

6 seconds longer. Is that really a problem? As the saying goes "It is better to be late in this world than to be early in the next!" Back to Westminster and because we are in a new session a draw will now take place for Private Members Bills. Private Members Bills are Bills brought to the house by individual members of Parliament rather than the Government. As there is limited time for Bills in any session, a draw takes place of members who want to propose a Bill and they submit their names. There will be several hundred names in the draw, and you realistically must be at least in the top 20 to have any chance of bringing a Bill to the House. We can enter the draw on Tuesday and Wednesday and the draw then takes place on Thursday, so fingers crossed! My plans for the Platinum weekend are firming with visits to Newton Aycliffe Town Centre and Woodham, but also Brafferton, Sedgefield, Fishburn, Trimdon Grange, Wingate, Heighington and Ferryhill scheduled so far. Hopefully I will see you at one of these but if not, I hope you enjoy whatever you have planned.

Are you, or someone you know, suffering with drug or alcohol addiction?

Durham Constabulary is working with the charity Humankind to reach out and support people in the Newton Aycliffe and Shildon areas who are suffering with addiction with a new pilot programme called Ahead of the Arrest.

The brainchild of Sergeant Andy Boyd, the scheme sees officers actively engage with members of the community who need help and offers a range of support programmes to get their lives back on track. Sgt Boyd said: "We know that addiction is a major factor for many people who go on to commit crime so this problem-solving initiative is something we hope will break that cycle. It allows us to identify vulnerable people, step in and give them that support to help them get their lives back on track.

"By working with the experts at Humankind, we can give the right support and help people and their families before they get to the point where we are having to arrest them after they commit crimes directly related to their addiction.'

The initiative officially launched on April 8, with officers proactively engaging with people who have come to the attention of the police in recent weeks. The idea being that we can help vulnerable people before they regularly come to the attention of the police. 5 out of 13 people engaged with so far have agreed to work with Humankind to address their issues.

"We found one man collapsed outside one address who was clearly suffering from alcoholism and in a state," Sgt Boyd said. "We took him to hospital and on revisiting explained what we could help with and he teared up saying he was so pleased we had stepped in. He is now engaging with several different services and getting that vital support." Sgt Boyd added: "This gentleman is just one of the cases where we have been able to step in and break that cycle of behaviour which not only helps that individual but the whole community.

"I would urge anyone who suffers with drugs or alcohol to get in touch we want them to know they don't have to tackle this on their own. "Tomorrow is a good day to start on the road to recovery, but today is even better. Help us to help you in getting Ahead of the Arrest.'
