

Those looking to cause anti-social behaviour in Newton Aycliffe will be targeted as a new project sees the installation of CCTV cameras across the town.

The project – led by the Neighbourhood Policing Team - is a first for County Durham and Darlington, seeing partners tirelessly work together to install five Rapid Deployment CCTV cameras.

The cameras are installed in key locations



"Newton Aycliffe is full of amazing people and when we all work together it shows what we can achieve.

"This project puts Newton Aycliffe on the map for implementing long term sustainable problem-solving initiatives between key partners and since the introduction of one camera, which was given to us on a loan agreement, we have seen anti-social behaviour reduce in Newton Aycliffe by more than 50 per cent."

Inspector Sarah Honeyman added: "I am delighted that our partners, the GAMP AAP, county councillors, Durham County Council, Great Avcliffe Town Council and Livin have funded this initiative and enabled the purchase of the CCTV cameras to be used across the GAMP area.

"These cameras will assist the police in the detection and prevention of anti-social behaviour and crime and support our aim to ensure Newton Aycliffe and Middridge continue to be safe and enjoyable places to live and work."

The project is GAMP funded from all seven of the town's county councillors, supported by funding from Great Aycliffe Town Council and Livin.

Brian Riley, GAMP Coordinator, said: "Great Aycliffe & Middridge Partnership fully support the CCTV cameras for the Aycliffe area. "This project has shown again what can be achieved when all key partners work together. Durham County Council, GAMP, Livin and Great Aycliffe Town Council have all worked alongside the local Neighbourhood Police Team to bring this project together, which will hopefully help to reduce antisocial behaviour in the Aycliffe area. "A big thank you to all partners involved from the GAMP Board." Great Aycliffe Town Council's Mayor, Councillor Ken Robson, added: "The Town Council has been concerned at the increasing anti-social behaviour problems in the town in recent years, having experienced an increasing number of incidents in its parks. This has impacted on staff welfare and safety and spoiled the public's enjoyment of the Council's facilities. The Council is keen to work with the Newton Aycliffe Police Team and other partners such as Livin and Durham County Council to address the problems, and the Rapid Deployment CCTV Camera Project offered an ideal opportunity to work together to address the problems."

A spokesperson for Livin said: "As part of our local offers we were keen to support the police with this re-deployable camera for the Western Estate and since the camera was installed a number of local residents have told both Livin employees and the police how much safer they feel."

Daniel del Soldato, Head of Communications at WCCTV Ltd, said: "WCCTV is incredibly proud that our market-leading deployable cameras have yet again proven their value in preventing crime and assisting with the prosecution of offenders.

"With the proactive approach Durham Police have taken, supported by our camera technology, there's no place to hide for those who wish to engage in anti-social behaviour."

Durham Police and Crime Commissioner, Joy Allen, added: "I am delighted to see excellent partnership working and cooperation delivering such positive results. These new cameras will undoubtedly make the communities of Newton Aycliffe safer and more secure and I hope other towns and partnerships will follow Newton Aycliffe's lead."

Dear Sir,

My name is Aaron Durham and I was born and raised in the town of Newton Aycliffe. For the last 22 years I have been serving in the British Army as a Royal Engineer. This year I was selected as one of the Royal Engineer Corps team riders and last month I participated in the Royal Engineers mountain bike training camp and had my first Gravity Enduro Race, representing the Royal Engineers, in Llanfyllin Wales on 12th June 2022.

The event was round two of the five Army Inter Corps Enduro Race Season and started at 9.30am.

To complete a loop, on average, takes a rider between 2-3 hours to complete the six stages. It consists of six mountainous up and downhill rides, the times which count are the six downhill elements of the race. All



race runs were recorded, using a rider worn timing chip, then totalled up for a combined time issued at the end of the race. As a team we won round two of the Army Inter Corps Enduro Race Season, we also had the first individual, who was Elliot Downes, in a time of 8 minutes and 55 seconds for 600 meters descending difficult rocky, rooty, loose and technical downhill

I managed to finish in the top half of the field and I am slowly making my way up the rankings, if I can manage to stay rubber side down for all six runs, with no offs next time, I should finish a little higher in the table. Aaron Durham

Any participant bringing their dogs should ensure they are kept on a lead during the community walk.





THE BELLRINGERS OF ST. MICHAEL'S CHURCH, HEIGHINGTON

Chris Enzor has been ringing bells for 53 years. His wife Anthea, who is also Tower [Bell] Captain, a mere 47 years. Chris told me, "Here at St. Michael's the 6 bells have been ringing out across the centuries, both good news and, yes, bad news too, for the residents of Heighington and beyond. Even wartime was catered for when the toll of a bell was a warning, so, to resolve the problem and to allow practice to go ahead, the bell tower was fitted with 6 tiny bells which still hang on the walls, one for each of their bigger cousins and known as a Seage's apparatus. These were used to make much less of a sound when rung." Inventive or what? Ask to see them. Anthea would be happy to give anyone the tour. The inventiveness continues, so, for all you techies, read on. With the aid of a grant from the Durham & Newcastle Diocesan Association of Church Bell Ringers, a simulator was purchased which, with a computer, allows all six bells to be rung without a sound, which is good for training. The clappers must be silenced first by tying them to the side of the bells. But it does not end there. A learner can ring one bell and the computer puts in the sound of the other five without them being rung at all. So very clever and means that practice can be done with just a teacher and the computer, saving frustration for the learner and precious time for the ringers. Contact Anthea for further details and to see the simulator in action at Holy Trinity, Darlington.

Anthea informs me, "Almost anyone can learn to ring. You do not have to be a good musician, good at maths, or very strong. It is within the capabilities of most people. Ringers come from all walks of life and all you need is enthusiasm and a willingness to commit time to your new hobby. And, of course, the bells have a history all of their own, but that is another story for another day."

Presently, at Heighington, there are 5 or 6 beginners coming along at 7pm on Wednesday's, with about the same number to support them. The session continues until 9pm for the 11 regular ringers, who then adjourn to the pub (sounds good). Practice also happens on the 2nd and 4th Monday's 10.30am until 12 noon. Do you fancy learning the ropes? (Definitely a pun intended) Anthea would be delighted to hear from you.



A combination of scheduled meetings in the constituency and rail strikes meant I did not attend Westminster in person last week although I did via Teams a couple of times. The first of these was a weekly meeting with the DEFRA (Department for Environment, Farming and Rural Affairs) team. This is the 30-minute meeting we have each Monday to make sure we understand the ministers' priorities for the week and the support they need.

I also got news this week that I have been accepted on the Armed Forces Parliamentary Scheme, this is a scheme where members of Parliament can visit military establishments and get a better understanding of our Armed Forces and the incredible work they do. Later last Monday I went to Newcastle for a dinner to discuss inward investment in our region with other stakeholders. Tuesday saw me at NETPark for the first of 3 visits that week, again talking about future opportunities. This science park is a genuine hub of opportunity for our region and it's a real pleasure to support it. Then it was off to meet headteachers at Ferryhill as they are having some ASB issues that I am trying to help them get support for. Wednesday was a busy day where I took the opportunity to do some

Wednesday was a busy day where I took the opportunity to do some things normally not possible as, typically, I would be in London. I started with a Business Breakfast meeting on NETPark at 7.45am before heading to Wingate to join a community walk. It was good to listen to residents I have not seen for a while and to make some new connections. After that it was my privilege to visit Rare Rockets on Aycliffe Industrial Estate. I first met Craig and his team at the Make Your Mark Awards and arranged then to go and meet the full team. They have a business that works to both support deaf people in the community but also support hearing people understand how best to engage with deaf people. Then it was back to NETPark for a meeting to discuss the North East Space Hub before back to the office for a catch up with Nicola from Citizens Advice. Citizens Advice are one of the agencies my team engage with regularly and it is always good to meet properly instead of by Teams.

Thursday saw me at Tesco, Newton Aycliffe, to meet the local manager. We talked about everything from stock levels to the pressures on cost of living and their engagement with local charities. I'm planning to do some pop-up sessions in the store in the near future so, if you see me there, please feel free to come over for a chat. I then visited a farmer who had written on a number of subjects before catching up with the local Pigeon Federation. I now know a lot more about pigeon racing and can represent their interests better. Friday started with the delight of visiting Fishburn Primary school to support the studies they are doing on Parliament, but, in particular, the role of the suffragettes. Elaine Peeke, Durham County Councillor for Bishop Middleham and Cornforth, came with me to the school and was able to provide a perspective about women's engagement in politics, that I couldn't. I also gave them a number of documents from Westminster to hopefully further enhance their studies. After this it was on to Durham University Business School and then County Hall for a series of meetings with first the Economic Partnership and then the council leadership team.

Saturday was Armed Forces Day. I was out and about across the constituency, starting with the raising of the flag with Ferryhill Town Council, then St Luke's for a Community Fair before heading up to Station Town and later to Trimdon Grange Community Centre for their Armed Forces Day events.

If you feel inspired to start running, or want to run with like-minded people, our sessions cater for people of all abilities. Every Monday we have a Beginner's Run that starts at 6:30pm at the Oakleaf Sports Complex at School Aycliffe Lane. It is a steady run that can be used if you are a beginner, returning from injury or just looking for a social run with like-minded people. It is a very welcoming session and perfect for anyone starting out.

Every Tuesday we have the main outdoor running session which starts at 7pm. Usually, we meet at the Sports Complex but there are occasions where we meet somewhere else depending on where the session takes place. These sessions are usually interval sessions over various distances and will focus on strength, speed and stamina and is aimed to replicate how you would run in a race. We do this in 3 groups so that the session can fit around people of all abilities. Again, ideal if you want to take your running to the next level and build up speed but also good for all abilities and running with like-minded people. There are some excellent sessions. On Thursday's we meet at Shildon 2000 Stadium with the session starting at 6:30pm. We usually meet at Sunnydale Leisure Centre from 6:15pm with the option for a warm up around the edge of the

There are other sessions that some members will organise and Wednesdays there will be some social runs which can be used as a recovery run and it's also a good opportunity to have a chat with someone as you run. Those sessions usually start at 6:30pm at the Oakleaf Sports Complex but check out our Facebook page before attending any of the sessions to make sure they are still taking place. We start all sessions with a gentle warm up although sometimes at the track there will be activities to get you moving as well as our loud speaker playing out everyone's favourite tunes! All sessions finish with a cool down and some static stretches. We would love it if you came along and tried one of the sessions. We know that once you do, you will be back on a regular basis and it may be YOU that ends up with your name in our race reports. The good thing about running is that you can do it pretty much anywhere and it can be free. Running with others helps keep you motivated and also gives you confidence to push on and do more. Being active is not only good for your physical health but equally important for your mental health. 

Neighbourhood Policing By PCSO Alfie Middleton

Hello to all reading this, The Neighbourhood, Response and Crime teams working out of Newton Aycliffe have been busy responding to a variety of incidents across the area over the past week, including concerns for safety, missing persons, domestic incidents and harassment.

Below is a snapshot of what we have been up to:

On Monday, officers attended an address off Central Avenue working alongside the RSPCA and local vets to rescue a variety wildlife. This was on the back of information received from members of the public who had expressed concerns about the conditions birds and fish in particular, were being kept in at the address. Under the Animal Welfare Act a number of animals, birds and fish were

On Tuesday, PCSO Todd completed a Herbert Protocol for a local resident. We have been supporting some vulnerable members of our community suffering with dementia by linking in with them and their loved ones and signing them up to the Herbert protocol. If you know someone vulnerable in this way, please contact us on herbertprotocol@durham.pnn.police.uk or message the Facebook page and we'll get back to you as soon as we can.

Wednesday saw the installation of our new CCTV cameras. This sees five new rapid deployment cameras located in different areas of the town which can move within a short time frame. The project is GAMP funded from all seven of the town's County Councillors, supported by funding from Great Aycliffe Town Council and Livin. So a massive thank you to them, the county council, PC Welch and the Neighbourhood team that worked hard to get them up and running. We really hope that this reassures you that we are committed to reducing Anti-Social Behaviour and Crime in Newton Aycliffe. On Thursday, Officers attended a year 11 leavers gathering next to the athletics track to the rear of Woodham School. Officers attended after a report of a 100 persons fighting, however when officers attended there were no issues and those there present were enjoying celebrating the end of their secondary education. We are not the fun police and ensured that all present were behaving themselves and properly safeguarded.

On Friday, PCSO Todd was out in the community with Humankind getting 'Ahead of the Arrest'. This is a joint initiative targeting members of the community who are suffering with drug or alcohol misuse. The aim here is to help those suffering in silence, getting them the support they need before it gets to crisis point, or they are committing offences which lead to them being arrested. This has been running for a couple of months now and around a third of all visited are now engaging with Humankind programmes. On Saturday we ensured we patrolled the areas that have been reported to have issues based on the calls to Police and the messages on Facebook. We patrolled the Town Centre and Western Area of Newton Aycliffe. We engaged with a number of youths, and in the main it appeared that all were behaving themselves. Lastly, if you haven't already and have a spare minute, please sign up to 'Keep in the Know' where you can receive regular alerts from the team here on what's happening around the town, such as crime updates and road closures.
