Newton Press Awarded 'Heart of the Community'

Newton Press, Winners of the County Durham Environmental Awards 2018 in the 'Greener Business' category, were delighted to have also won the "Heart of the Community" category at the Durham, Sunderland & South Tyneside Regional Business Awards 2019.

The shortlist for each category consists of just three companies/organisations picked from a list of over 1000 entries, the winner of which was crowned at the Durham, Sunderland & South Tyneside Regional Business Awards heat on Thursday 14th March 2019 at Ramside Hall Hotel.

The prestigious black tie evening hosted a drinks reception with formal proceedings following. Newton Press was founded by the late Syd Howarth in 1963, it has always been at the forefront of the community it serves – not only in providing print and a free weekly community newspaper, but in leading social and environmental projects of benefit, not only to the region, but also national organisations.

The latest in a long line of projects, is instigating and providing the Darlington & Bishop Auckland MRI Scanner Appeal and then giving gifts of posters, leaflets, design work and advertising features.

Newton Press, a family run business, are specialists in the print industry and have been established for over 56 years. The company experienced record sales in 2018 as well as significant growth in the last 18 months and are committed to new technology, investing in the latest world leading Eco-Friendly print machinery allowing planet friendly, exceptional fast printing. A local Youth and Community Centre is putting to good use a new cooker that has recently been installed. Newton Aycliffe Youth and Community Centre have taken delivery of a new cooker thanks to a grant from Great Aycliffe and Middridge Partnership. Thanks to funding from local county councillors

the group were awarded £1500 to purchase and install a new unit. Councillors John Clare, Eddy Adam, Kate Hopper, Paul Howell, Scott Durham, Jim Atkinson and Sarah Iveson supported the project through their Neighbourhood Budgets. After years of use the old cooker was no longer fit for purpose or working as it should. The centre and its user groups were beginning to struggle to provide the cooking services required. The new range master style cooker provides a much needed upgrade and will hopefully encourage new users into the centre, who may have cooking/catering requirements. A group who have benefitted greatly from the new addition is the 'Monday Lunch Club' who meet every Monday at the centre. BLUE PLAQUE FOR THE AYCLIFFE ANGELS

A collaboration between Durham-based Women's Banner Group, local schools and a Lancaster University project is looking to commemorate important local women through a blue plaque hustings. Local schools and members of the public were invited to submit nominations for a female blue plaque in Co Durham.

Secretary of the WBG, Lynn Gibson, says, "There are currently no blue plaques in the area dedicated to women, only men or buildings, despite having many local women of importance. We hope to be able to rectify that through this process."

At the event, there will be a hustings to decide which of the nominated women will go forward. The event will be held on Saturday 30th March at 1pm at the Durham Miners' Association, Redhills. Members of the public are welcome to attend this event to vote on which female blue plaque the WBG will be submitting to Durham County Council. Also at the event will be the Remembering Resistance project, from Lancaster University which is bringing the history of women's activism to life.

The Women's Banner Group, founded in 2017, was set up to promote

female empowerment and to recognise and celebrate the achievements of local women throughout the years. WBG created a mass movement in 2018, which resulted in over 100 women marching at the Durham Miners' Gala 2018 with a banner created by 12 groups of women from across the region.

Likewise, in this Editorial column, as we scan through the week's edition and comment on items which have caught our attention, you can be assured that the sole focus of the Newton News is the welfare of the community.

OUR WONDERFUL YOUTH

So - what has caught our eye this week? Overwhelmingly, it has been the achievements of some of our young people, whom we see landing a Level 4 apprenticeship, debating the future, dancing at the Gala Theatre, recommending rugby, winning at swimming

RESPONDING TO THE CLIMATE EMERGENCY

Dear Sir,
On 20th February, Durham County Council passed a 'Climate Emergency' motion, pledging to make both the Council, and County Durham, carbon neutral as quickly as possible. In my role as DCC Cabinet Support: Economy & Regeneration, this falls within my purview and thus, last week, I attended the 'Big Energy Summit' conference in Warwick. I was one of the speakers at the conference, and was able to tell delegates about the amazing work being done by DCC's Low Carbon team, which has seen carbon emissions in both the Council and the County fall by 40% since 2010 (two years ahead of target). **THE PROBLEMS FACING US** I also shared some personal views about the task facing us. For all its success, DCC has still to cut or to

offset 60,000 tonnes CO2e per annum, and County Durham as a whole needs to lose 2.5 million tonnes CO2 pa. Outside the Council, DCC has no powers of enforcement, will be losing EU funding, and faces a huge task facilitating the retrofit of domestic and industrial buildings, the creation of the necessary infrastructure for low-carbon energy & heating, and the decarbonising of traffic and farming. I wonder how many people realise that zero-carbon requires a move away from gas central heating? Or that the national grid would be unable to service a significant increase in the number of electric vehicles? Or that modern animal husbandry contributes perhaps a fifth of all our carbon emissions? Or that we do not have a sufficient workforce with the skills to install and maintain carbon neutral systems? I also shared my personal agreement with the 'Silesia Declaration' that was passed at last year's COP24 UN Climate Change Conference – that if we are to bring in carbon neutrality and renewable energy, we must do so without damaging the economy or losing jobs. **LESSONS FROM THE CONFERENCE** However, having got all the negatives off my chest, I came home FULL of ideas!! It was useful to be able to hear about the amazing work being done by Bristol, Warrington, Nottingham City and Dumfries & Galloway Councils. And I heard very helpful presentations by representatives from the government's Department for Business, Energy & Industrial Strategy and other experts on: EVs; data developments; how to plan and fund energy efficiency/low carbon projects; retrofit Trustmark; LEP Regional Hubs et al. The DCC Climate Emergency motion requires a report to Full Council before September with the actions the Council will need to take to achieve a carbon neutral Council and County, so I will keep you updated on the progress of this ELE issue. OUTRAGED MP OVER HITACHI SNUB

Dear Sir,
When I was informed Hitachi's joint bid with Bombardier lost out to Siemens for the contract to build Deep Tube trains I found the decision disappointing to say the least. But when I discovered that Transport for London were aware the majority of these trains would be built in Austria not the UK, the decision is not just disappointing but outrageous. Originally I was informed that Siemens would be building a new factory in Goole as part of the deal. However, following a Freedom of Information request, it appears that TfL knew that Siemens intended to build trains in Vienna. It leads me to wonder whether any of the trains will be built in the UK? Workers I have spoken to from the Newton Aycliffe Hitachi are angry, and they have every right to be. The decision to award the contract to Siemens undermines a commitment to manufacturing in the UK. I have written to the London Mayor and TfL to raise my concerns about the decision that was made. I also intend to raise the issue with the Business Secretary Greg Clark and Transport Secretary Chris Grayling who last month said the government "would do everything it can" for Hitachi. Voters in County Durham are being encouraged to have their say in election arrangements for their area. Durham County Council is carrying out a review of all polling districts, places and stations and is asking residents for their views. The authority is legally required to undertake a review every five years, giving people the chance to offer any suggestions for changes to specific polling places and districts, as well as the suitability of polling places, including access and any potential alternatives. A polling district is a geographical sub-division of an electoral ward, while a polling place is the area of a building where a polling station is located. Letter re.'Brexit Bung'

Dear Sir,
I refer to the above 'article' in last week's Newton News which was not attributed to any writer.

The Article is a re-write of the history of Austerity and a propaganda attack on the democratic majority Leave vote. It is also misleading with regards to Regional Funding post Brexit. The organisation quoted, 'Best for Britain' want us to remain E.U. members and, unlike the Leave campaign, is establishment funded.

Potted history of Austerity.

1. The Banks, which were not properly regulated under New Labour PM's Blair and Brown, crashed, leaving Britain on the verge of bankruptcy with our credit rating at risk. [Remember the out-going Treasury Minister left a note for the Conservatives to the effect that there was no money left!]
2. The General Election, in which the Conservatives suggested austerity, not as a policy of choice, but as a necessity, resulted in the Coalition Government.
3. At the next General Election Cameron proposed more Austerity and a Referendum on E.U. membership while Labour's Ed. Milliband offered 'Austerity- Lite. Cameron was elected, only to stand down when Vote Leave won the promised Referendum. [He had campaigned for Remain]. From the above it is evident that Labour were mainly responsible for the Banking crisis and that Austerity was not ideological; rather it was a necessity and its continuation was mandated by the electorate when they elected David Cameron's Government.

Local Government and Austerity. Despite austerity, virtually all Local Authorities have managed to meet their statutory levels of service. Indeed, Durham County Council was still able to transfer its £3.4M loans to Durham Cricket Club into shares in the failing enterprise during austerity. In response to 'Best for Britain's' claim that Local Government funding cuts of £8.3 billion have been "devastating", as a taxpayer I can only say that Local Government still exists and is delivering its services in a much more streamlined way that represents better value for money. The success of Local Government absorbing the cuts begs the question; what would the £8.3 billion have been wasted on had it not been cut due to austerity? Indeed, during the austerity period the Government has created 3.2 million new jobs

and have, presumably, re-employed the workers that Local Authorities had to make redundant to become more efficient. As a taxpayer this is a win-win situation. I don't feel devastated.

E.U. Regional Grants.

The E.U. does not have any money! It collects taxpayer's money from the richer member states and distributes it to less well-off member states. Britain is a nett contributor – we get back £8 to £10 billion LESS than we pay in.

WHEN we leave the E.U. we will no longer contribute money, for the E.U. to distribute only a PART of our contribution to British Regions. Our Government will decide on its own, where and how, to distribute the monies it would otherwise have contributed to the E.U. That is, there will be more money to be distributed (plus approx. £8 to £10 billion pa - commonly known as, "the Brexit dividend"). For this reason you should ensure that you vote for a party which wanted to Leave the E.U. and which, unlike Labour/Momentum, represents the whole of Britain and is not controlled by Corbyn from London. Personally, I've decided never again to vote for a pro-E.U. candidate.

NAWMC The Big Club - The Journey So Far

A new Management Team was co-opted into place in September 2017. Their task was to steer the Club out of severe financial difficulties, at the start the new financial year in October 2017.

The team inherited a significant debt legacy, declining sales and an operating loss of over £1000 per week. The Clubs Accountants made it quite clear that if immediate steps weren't taken to rectify the current trading performance, bankruptcy was imminent.

The turning point in the Clubs fortunes was the sale of the ex-steward's house in November along with an unpresented investment from several members. The combination of the two pots of monies allowed the Management Team to settle the debt legacy in full.

A recovery plan was put in place with the immediate priorities being to take cost out of the supplier base and increase bar sales revenue. Negotiations with all suppliers resulted in several changes to the supply base, with significant cost savings being achieved for the year ahead. The major supplier was the brewery partner. Despite several years of continual service the partnership only served to fuel the decline and increase the debt.

The team then set an ambitious sales growth plan. The plan included actions to increase the membership and enticing lapsed members back into the Club. Given the lack of investment in the structure of the building, along with the dated decor, a major challenge lay ahead. On a "shoe string" budget the Management Team supported by several dedicated members, started refurbishing and decorating areas throughout the Club. One major spark of inspiration was the conversion of a small, infrequently used, lounge into what was surely Newton Aycliffe's first dedicated Gin Bar. In the past year this bar has contributed nearly half of the double digit sales growth achieved by the Club.

Throughout the early part of 2018 the bar sales continued to grow and were underpinned by regular entertainment events in the concert hall. Getting the right blend of entertainment, to convince members to return to weekend events, took some time and a lot of hard work. A mix of local up and coming acts and tribute acts soon began to pay dividends and now some eighteen months later the 2019 events calendar is almost full.

Due to the England football teams progress to the World Cup semi finals, bar sales started to escalate as members supported the games on mass. Our Club Steward, Gary Hepple, provided a varied selection of bar food to compliment the occasion and the atmosphere in the Club reached new

levels of positivity.

The half year accounts demonstrated a significant overall improvement in all areas of the Clubs business, which brought a level of stability and growing confidence for the future. However, to attain future prosperity a real step change was required. This change was achieved by introducing a new primary brewery supplier in November. Following months of negotiations an agreement was reached with Heineken UK. Heineken's promise was to provide our members with an unbeatable product range with quality guaranteed by installing the latest cellar technology, Smart Dispense. Our members have embraced the change and once again supported the Club with increased custom. Today we are proud of the progress made in such a short time by the Management Team, Steward and Bar Staff and not forgetting the incredible support from the membership. The Big Club still retains its roots as a working men's club but it now has so much more to offer. Members now have enhanced options including, the main bar, the Sheraton Bar, the Copper Room (House of Gin), newly refurbished concert hall delivering weekly quality entertainment and the upstairs lounge for Saturday night regulars to enjoy. In addition, we have a vision to create a community hub to fully utilise the building and offer a wider choice of facilities. Play Cafe use the Club during school holidays to provide activities and support to families in need. The Town Band holds twice weekly practise sessions. Weight Watchers on a Thursday evening. Zumba classes on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Newton Aycliffe Community Spirit Group held the first of many craft and trade fairs in early March and will also be staging under twelve discos.

Many charity organisations, such as Newton Aycliffe Rotary Club and Aycliffe Community Engagement, are now using the Club to host charity nights for some very worthy causes. Two new additions to the Club are our football team who play in the Wear Valley Sunday League and have reached the Division 2 Cup Final at the end of April The Big Club darts team who play in the Durham Super League.

D.I.N.O. (Democracy In Name Only) People

In 1979 Scotland voted FOR Devolution by 51.62%, turnout was 63.72%. In 1997 Wales voted FOR Devolution by 50.30%, turnout was 50.22% in 2004 the North East of England voted by 77.93% NO - against an Elected Assembly for the North East, turnout was 47.71% In 2011 The Country voted NO to the Alternative Vote System by 67.90%, turnout was 42.20%. In all the above referendums no one, I repeat no one, asked for a rerun it was called democracy and the will of the people had to be respected and implemented.

At the EU referendum, sorry I meant Peoples Vote, on 23rd June 2016 County Durham people voted 59.35% to Leave, turnout was 68.7%. Nationally it was 51.95% Leave, turnout was 72.21%. In the 2017 General Election both the Tories and Labour promised in their manifestos to respect the EU Referendum result plus Ukip representing 82.20% of the vote with a turnout of 68.7%. 27,142,411 out of 32,181,756 people voted for parties that promised to deliver Brexit.

Even our MP Phil Wilson, in his now infamous anti Corbyn letter in the 2017 General Election, stated "I put local people and local concerns first, from backing Brexit, etc..."

Many people who voted remain not only accepted the majority decision but recognise the danger to our system of democracy of not doing so. They would not necessarily vote remain in a second referendum precisely because it would undermine democracy and the rule of law.

There have been 20 General Elections in Britain since 1945. These resulted in 11 Conservative led governments and 9 Labour ones. Twice the party with the most votes did not win the most seats.

No single party has ever received more than a 50% share of the votes. No single party has ever received more than 40% of the total electorate. In 11 of the 20 elections, the Conservative vote majority over Labour or the Labour vote majority over Conservative, was smaller than the Leave majority over Remain in the 2016 referendum.

On no occasion since 1945 has there been a widespread campaign to rubbish any general election result on the basis that the support for the party with the most parliamentary seats was insufficient to justify that party forming a government. If there can be two referendums, why leave it at that, why not make it the best of three or five. To justify the gamble, Remain would have to win convincingly - with a bigger majority than they lost by in 2016, and on a bigger turnout.

Some Remainers would like us to continue having referendums until they get the result they want. But if they got the result they want, why would we not demand further referendums again, till we got what we want.

Those Remoaners who say that 17.4 million people did not know what they were voting for, in a straight in or out referendum, as David Cameron made absolutely clear on National Television and the government in its £9 million booklets to every household, no ifs no buts, not subject to deals, just in or out; must also accept that the 16.1 million Remain Voters didn't have a clue either. Accept democracy or go and live in "socialist Venezuela or a few other tinpot dictatorships still around. If you do not respect democracy and the rule of law, how can you expect others to respect you.

CrossFit has provided a whole new sphere of opportunities for me, both in sport by being selected for the County Rugby Team, to the rest of my life by just having more confidence. It's been the best form of exercise I've found and thanks to the amazing coaches I'm hitting new PB's and improving week after week.

To anyone even considering joining I'd say do it! It will help both physically and mentally - and you'll meet loads of amazing new people while improving yourself!

OPERATION SPRUCE UP VISITS MORE COUNTY VILLAGES

A campaign which encourages residents to get together to ensure their neighbourhoods look their best is showing no signs of slowing down in 2019. Durham County Council's Operation Spruce Up has already visited West Cornforth and Ushaw Moor this year and is heading to Newton Aycliffe and Wolsingham in the coming months. Launched in November 2016, the deep cleaning programme sees council workers join forces with residents, schools and businesses to improve the

local environment.

It has proven a great success, winning Campaign of the Year at Keep Britain Tidy Awards 2018.

In Ushaw Moor, the Spruce Up team focused on the B6302, Broom Lane, Boundary Close, Station Road and surrounding areas. In West Cornforth, they concentrated on High Street, Station Road, The Oval and surrounding areas.

Work included sweeping and clearing footpaths, replacing old bins, repairing benches and fencing, removing weeds from paths and green spaces, pruning and replanting shrub beds, clearing gullies, pruning trees, a litter pick and painting and maintaining bollards, fences and benches. The council's Civic Pride team also delivered assemblies at Silver Tree Primary School and St Joseph's Roman Catholic Primary School in Ushaw Moor about the importance of looking after the local environment. Silver Tree staff and

pupils also helped the campaign's mascot Tidy Ted plant summer bedding planters, while St Joseph's pupils produced posters encouraging residents to care for the area as a part of a competition. The winning poster will be displayed on the school gates and in businesses and community buildings across the village. In West Cornforth, the work was complemented by additional planting in the High Street, funded by local county councillors.

Land was also prepared for a new nature area, which will be packed full of bird and bee friendly plants. In Spring, Durham County Council staff will plant up the area alongside volunteers from Cornforth in Bloom, Cornforth Partnership and Cornforth Parish Council. Oliver Sherratt, head of environment at Durham County Council, said: "Operation Spruce Up is a great initiative as it targets one area at a time in a co-ordinated and concentrated

manner.

"This means residents can see a real difference in a short period of time, and by encouraging communities to get involved, it creates a sense of local pride."

STILL TIME TO SHAPE ALLOTMENT POLICY IN COUNTY

Ensuring allotments are the thriving horticultural centres they should be is at the heart of a review on how key green spaces are maintained in County Durham.

Allotment tenants, waiting list applicants and residents are all urged to get involved in the Durham County Council consultation, which looks at allotment provision across the county and how activities on them should be managed.

The consultation began last month and runs until Saturday, 31 March, meaning there is still time to help shape new policies clarifying what allotment tenants can and cannot do on their plots in the future.

Cllr Ossie Johnson, Cabinet member for culture, leisure and rural issues at Durham County Council, said: "Allotments are wonderful places that allow people to grow their own fruit and vegetables. This not only enriches diets by providing nutritious food, but can improve mental health, as connecting with nature and spending time in the fresh air has been shown to boost our sense of wellbeing.

"It is very important we protect allotments and ensure they are available to those who genuinely wish to enjoy horticulture activities. I would encourage anyone with an interest in the future of allotments to get involved in this consultation."

The council owns 159 allotment sites across the county. Of these, 106 are managed by the council, and the remaining 53 sites are managed by allotment associations on its behalf.
